Summer Exams

Please make sure that you have read the Exam Arrangements Summer 2017 information sheet that was e-mailed out last week which lists the main exam venues. Please check the seating lists for each exam which will be displayed on the exam notice board in the Sixth Form café at St Aidan's, in the Collins Entrance at St John Fisher and outside CGH. If you are in CGH for exams, all bags and coats should be left in PE2.

Year 13 Leaving Arrangements

The last day of teaching for Year 13 is Wednesday 24 May.

On Thursday 25 May students may wear their old school uniform into school. After registration, the Leavers' Service will take place in SJF Chapel at 9.10, followed by St Aidan's Leavers' Assembly in the St Aidan's main hall period 2.
