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Careers Information

UCAS deadline - Thursday 12 October

If you are applying to UCAS and have not yet handed in your UCAS form you need to do so **by Thursday 12 October**. Please take your completed form to the Careers Department for it to be checked and signed off. Should you need any help with your form or personal statement please make a careers appointment ASAP.

William Akroyd Scholarship

Each year several students from the Sixth Form apply for a William Akroyd Scholarship. The competition takes the form of a general essay paper lasting two hours and containing twelve questions on topics of current significance. Questions are not based on any educational syllabus. They are designed rather to provide pupils with an opportunity to display their awareness of issues in the public domain, their capacity for independent thought about them, and their effectiveness in expressing their ideas. Candidates are required to write in response to one question. The paper is taken in school under invigilation. Both science-based and humanities-based pupils alike are encouraged to participate. This year the exam will take place in late November/early December 2017. A short-list of candidates who have entered the competition will be invited to attend at York for interview with the governors of the William Akroyd Foundation on Friday 2 March 2018. You may then be awarded a financial prize for the duration of your undergraduate studies (usually several hundred pounds per year). If you are interested in applying, see Mrs Richmond in Careers for a form. You must hand in your completed application form by the end of school on Wednesday 18 October.

The Max Edwards Internship Programme

Max Edwards, otherwise known as The Anonymous Revolutionary, was a young writer who wrote about revolutionary socialism in today's climate. His book was published in 2016 as a collection of articles from his blog by the same name. Max sadly passed away not long after his book was published at the age of 16. With the agreement of his family the Max Edwards Internship has been set up in his memory, offering two weeks paid work experience in the Westminster office of Ed Miliband MP to young people between the ages of 18-25 who are inspired by politics and particularly politics of the left. The dates for the work experience will be set according to the successful candidate's availability. Applications opened on 11 September and close on 1 November. To apply please answer the following question using no more than 2000 - 3000 words: 'What single innovative idea could make a major contribution to tackling inequality and how might we argue for its adoption?'
