### **ARRANGEMENTS FOR RESULTS DAY AND THE START OF TERM**

I am writing to explain the arrangements for the publication of Year 12 results and for the start of the new term in September.

#### **Results Day: Applied Courses, Further Mathematics and GCSE**

Any Year 12 results can be collected from the Constance Green Hall at St Aidan's on Thursday 16 August 2018 from 9.15 am. Careers Staff will be available to discuss results, and there will be a further opportunity to explore the implications of results in terms of future applications and course choices in September. If you are unable to collect your results on the day but would like them posted to you, please leave a **large** stamped addressed envelope (with the appropriate postage) at the Sixth Form Office before the end of term, writing on the reverse the subjects of the examinations taken.

GCSE results can be collected from St Aidan's Sixth Form Office on Thursday 23 August from 10.00 am. Again, please leave a stamped addressed envelope at the Sixth Form Office if you would like these posted to you.

#### **Start of term**

We aim to confirm Year 13 courses, as far as possible, before the end of the Summer Term. If however, results from the external assessments raise concerns about Year 13 options, students will need to consult their Senior Tutors and subject teachers before the start of the new term in September. They should contact the Sixth Form office on Thursday 30 or Friday 31 August to arrange this consultation. All Year 13 students should then return to school for the new term on Thursday 6 September at 8.45 am; Year 13 lessons will begin at 9.10 am on that day.

Please note that the deadlines for Higher Education applications come round very quickly in the Autumn Term: Oxbridge and Medicine applications have to be completed by Thursday 27 September, and other University applications are due by Thursday 18 October. It is therefore essential that students are efficient in their future planning and completion of application forms. Please note that, to help us to monitor this process and to maintain good study habits students are expected to be in school throughout the working week and will have allocated Supervised Study sessions on their timetable.

Finally, a reminder that there is no parking space on either school site for students. Students who need to use cars or motorbikes to come to school are asked to park off-site, and should not use their vehicles during the school day.

I hope that this information is helpful in preparing you for the months ahead, and wish you a very happy and restful summer holiday.
