GEOGRAPHY FIELDWORK TRIP 22-23 OCTOBER 2018

We are delighted that your son/daughter has opted to study A-level Geography and hope they soon feel settled on the course. As you are aware, students sit three exams at the end of Year 13. Fieldwork is a compulsory aspect of the A-level Geography course, and all students must participate in the 4-day fieldwork programme on offer. Two of these days are outlined in the letter below and take place on the 22 and 23 October 2018. Two further days, including a one-night residential are being planned for later in the academic year and information will follow about this later.

Fieldwork plays an important role in preparing students for all their exams as it enhances their understanding and ability to apply their knowledge in both physical (Paper 1) and human (Paper 2) geography. It also helps them to develop analysis skills, which leads to greater confidence and success when looking at geographical issues, essential for Paper 3. In addition, students will be expected to carry out an independent research project which requires them to develop an individual (unique) question, and plan methods to provide evidence to answer this. The trip in October is the first step in equipping students with a working knowledge of a variety of fieldwork methods and an opportunity to collect valuable primary data.

Over the two days, students will visit Leeds and the East Coast (Bridlington and Mappleton). The exact day they visit each place depends on their teaching group:

A variety of fieldwork will be carried out which includes questionnaires, pedestrian counts, cliff profiles, sketches, bi-polar analysis and land use surveys. Students will work in small groups around the various locations and although staff will check on students, they will not be directly supervised. They will be told where and how to contact a member of staff at all times.

The cost for the two days will be £20.00. The cost covers transport costs for both days and it should be available on your ParentPay account now and payment should be made by Thursday 11 October 2018. If your son/daughter is at St John Fishers, please contact the Finance Department at St Aidan's where they will be given a St Aidan's activation code and instructions.

Consent for the trip is required on ParentPay. Please note that by ticking the box online you are agreeing to your son/daughter taking part on the trip and the cost and confirming that their medical details are up to date. Information relating to health and emergency contacts is taken from the form filled in when your son/daughter entered Sixth Form. If there are any amendments to this information, or concerns that require further discussion please contact the school nurse. If your son/daughter's medical details indicate that they need medication such as inhalers, please ensure that they bring them on all fieldwork occasions; **otherwise we will be unable to take them**.

We will be outside for the majority of the fieldwork. Students therefore need to come <u>suitably dressed with</u> <u>warm clothes, waterproofs and sensible sturdy footwear</u>. It can be cold, wet and windy, and as there is limited shelter, it is best to be prepared. Students need to bring a clipboard if they have one and full writing equipment (pen, pencil and ruler) and a packed lunch. They will need a small rucksack or bag with a shoulder strap to carry during the day. Please note that we cannot leave students unaccompanied in Leeds, or drop them off en-route back to Harrogate.

School trips form an important part of the curriculum offered within school. When accompanying children on a school trip, staff are acting in *loco parentis* just as they do in school. However, trips away from the normal school environment involve taking into account different routines and environments, which demand that students are able to show an increased level of responsibility and maturity. In order to participate in any trip the school staff have to be confident that a student will be able to cope with the challenges that the trip presents.

The school will look at the behaviour, the attendance and the wellbeing of a student and decide whether they are able to cope with these demands **before** accepting the student onto any trip out of school. The decision to allow a student to participate will be taken between the Trip Leader, the Head of Year and senior staff. Once a student has been accepted onto a trip then, if in the time between gaining a place on the trip and the departure, staff have concerns again about the student's participation in the trip, the school reserves the right to withdraw the student's place.
