SMOKING

Please may we remind students that they are not permitted to roll or smoke cigarettes or to vape on either school site or within 1 mile of either site. We have explained the reasons for this already, in terms of the governors' strong anti-smoking policy, the need to preserve positive relationships with local residents and the need to represent the Association positively to the community and to younger pupils. Where we encounter a group of students, some of whom are smoking or vaping, it is not always possible to determine the identities of the smokers or vapers; in such a case we reserve the right to include students who have chosen to associate with the smokers or vapers in any resulting sanction.

If students are caught smoking or in the company of smokers within close proximity to either school's grounds then they will receive a warning letter, and then a final warning followed by a fixed term exclusion. In joining the Sixth Form, students have accepted and agreed to abide by the rules and expectations of the Associated Sixth Form. St Aidan's and St John Fisher are 11-18 schools and the Association is not a Further Education College and therefore all Sixth Form students are expected to set an example to the younger students and in the community.
