Range of Options

The Changing Curriculum

- New linear A Levels
- AS Levels not offered as part of A Level in linear courses
- Revision of Applied qualifications
- GCSE assessed by number not grade (C equivalent 4 or 5)



A Level Courses

New revised specifications in place for all subjects for September 2017:

- Two-year linear A Levels with all external assessments at the end of Year 13
- Longer, more challenging exams involving application of skills
- Reduction in coursework content in many subjects



2 year Applied Courses

- Mixture of portfolio and examination assessments
- Some courses modular with assessments taken and qualification attained at the end of Year 12; some linear assessment at end of Year 13.
- BTEC, AQA Level 3 Applied General, Cambridge Technicals
- In 2016 50% of BTEC entries attained Distinction* or Distinction
- UCAS points tariff values similar to A Levels



Other Courses

- Requirement to study GCSE Mathematics and/or English for students not attaining Grade 4 or above in Year 11
- Extended Project Qualification
- Core Maths
- Employability, Enrichment and Pastoral through Tutorial programme and fortnightly lesson Wednesday pm.



Extended Project Qualification

- Valued by universities and employers for independent study skills and initiative
- Weekly commitment to research and independent study alongside careful preparation and supervision
- Significant additional workload (research plus 5000 word essay or practical product)
- Not as important as the right grades in the right subjects
 universities unlikely to make a condition of offers
- Valued as 50% of A Level
- 71% of entries in last four years were at A* A



Core Maths qualification

- Valued by employers and universities
- Practical applications of Maths
- Supports other courses which involve Maths eg
 Geography, Economics, Biology, Psychology
- Ideal for students who don't want to choose Maths
 A Level but recognise the importance of higher level
 Maths qualification
- Weekly timetable commitment of 4 hours



Course structure / options

- Students follow a minimum of three A Level and/or Applied courses
- Some may choose to follow four A Levels depending upon prior attainment, aspirations and ability to cope with workload
- Students may add EPQ (all students) and/or Core Maths (three A Level students)
- GCSE Maths or English added to timetable for students who have not attained Grade 4 in Year 11

Progression Routes

- 2016: 93% of HE entrants gained 1st or 2nd choice


- Application Form available to download from the websites or this evening, to return by 3 March
