Mild/ Moderate Reaction

- ⚠ Itchy hives / nettle rash or flush

- ▲ Tummy pain / vomiting
- Mild wheeze

Action To Take



Give antihistamine medication

Dose:

 If wheezing, give 10 puffs of blue inhaler (Salbutamol) with mask and spacer

- Get someone to call emergency contact
- Do not leave child alone, watch progress
- If no improvement repeat antihistamine dose in 30 minutes and seek medical help

Severe Reaction

- ⚠ Difficulty breathing/ tight chest/ noisy breathing/ severe wheeze/ persistent cough
- ▲ Swelling of tongue
- ▲ Swelling / tightness of throat
- ⚠ Difficulty talking or swallowing/ hoarse voice
- ⚠ Dizziness or collapse/ loss of consciousness

Action To Take



- Keep child lying down on a flat surface with legs up the whole time
- Get someone to call 999 and say the problem is ANAPHYLAXIS (ANA-FI-LAX-IS)
- If wheezing give 10 puffs of blue inhaler (Salbutamol) with mask and spacer
- Do not leave child alone, watch progress
- If stops breathing or there is no pulse, start basic life support
- The child needs to be seen in hospital as soon as possible and observed for >4 hrs

For all allergic reactions

- Child should carry antihistamine medication with them at all times.
- Keep calm.
- Reassure child.
- Remove the trigger if possible.
- When you call 999 specify the name, age and location of the child.
- Child should rest: no exercise or heavy meals for at least 4 hours after the reaction.
- Inform your consultant and allergy nurse about all episodes of severe reactions.
