

Advanced Subsidiary and Advanced GCE Marks and Grades

All GCE schemes use a nationally-agreed uniform mark scale (UMS) to report the result of each unit and the subject awards.

The UMS grade equivalences for the unit result and subject awards are set out below.

Please note: For the new A Level Linear qualifications - UMS marks are not applicable.

Candidates whose level of achievement is below the minimum judged by the awarding bodies to be of sufficient standard to be recorded on a certificate will receive an **Unclassified (U)** result.
