- Colleges of Further Education may offer A Level courses together with a range of vocational and practical courses
- You can train you for a specific career and gain relevant qualifications in vocational subjects such as Digital Technologies, Engineering, Catering, Early Years and Education, Hair and Beauty Therapies, Agriculture etc.
- Qualifications offered are BTEC Extended National Diplomas, NVQ's, City & Guilds
- Most courses are for 1 or 2 years and can lead directly to employment or university

- As an apprentice you will:
 - o work for an employer alongside experienced staff
 - o gain job-specific skills
 - o earn a wage and get holiday pay
 - be given time to study for a nationally recognised qualification such as an NVQ which is relevant to your job
- It is possible to apply for an apprenticeship after your GCSE's or after A Levels/Level 3 Applied Courses
- Training can take between 1 and 2 years before you are fully qualified
- There are apprenticeships advertised in England for over 1,500 job roles
- You can contact employers directly to see if they will offer you an
 apprenticeship or you can register on <u>www.apprenticeships.org.uk</u> to be
 notified of vacancies as they become available in your chosen career sector
 and in your preferred location(s).
