Dear Parent/Guardian

Year 10 Trip to Salamanca, Sunday 21 June – Friday 26 June 2020

Following the success of our previous visits to Spain, I am delighted to be able to offer your son/daughter the opportunity to study at a renowned Spanish Language School. Not only is this trip intended to offer extra assistance to those taking the GCSE exam in June 2021 but it also offers children the opportunity to experience Spanish culture at first hand.

Since 2000, we have developed a close association with an excellent language academy in Salamanca, called ISLA. During the week, students will have intensive classes taught by talented and inspiring native speakers whilst enjoying the hospitality of a typical Spanish host family. Classes will run for 4 days with up to 5 hours tuition per day.

The trip will be from **Sunday 21 June to Friday 26 June 2020**. Students will stay with Spanish host families in pairs or threes on a full board basis of breakfast, cooked lunch and evening meal. There is no return aspect of this trip i.e. you will not need to host a Spanish student later in the year. Travel will be by coach and plane.


The cost of this trip will depend on numbers participating. Given ongoing uncertainty around exchange rates, Brexit and flights, which have not yet been released, we anticipate the cost to be in the range £600.00 - £700.00 to include all flights, transfers, accommodation, food, tuition fees, course materials, activities and graduation certificate. Please note that this an educational visit taking place in school time - it is not a holiday.

Students taking part are expected to complete the 20 hours of language tuition, to do all homework set and to participate fully in the cultural outings offered.

In addition to the time spent studying, there will be organised activities such as a tour of the city, a 'salsa' dance class, 'chocolate con churros', swimming, a 'tapas' tour and a photo competition. Salamanca itself is a beautiful town famous for its ancient university, cathedral and stunning architecture. The central area is fully-pedestrianized and all accommodation is within 15-20 minutes walking distance of ISLA and the town centre. Students will be allowed limited supervised free time for relaxation and shopping.

If you would like your son/daughter to go on the trip, please pay the **first non-refundable deposit of £200.00 by 09:00 on Monday 30 September 2019** on ParentPay. Please contact Mrs Holey in the Finance Office you do not have your log on details (<u>h.holey@staidans.co.uk</u>). Additional instalment payments will then be due in February 2020 and April 2020. An updated price schedule will be sent out once we know the final numbers of students attending.

Consent for the trip is required on ParentPay. Please note that by ticking the box online you are agreeing to your son/daughter taking part on the trip and the cost and confirming that their medical details, which we hold at school, are up to date.

Important Information

Please note that <u>all payments for this trip are non-refundable</u>, as we have to make regular payments to the Language School and book flights for your son/daughter.

Whilst we offer a payment schedule for the trip, please note that after Monday 30 September 2019, you will be required to **pay the full price of the trip if your son/daughter withdraws**, unless together we can find a replacement student. For that reason, we ask that you take the time to discuss the trip in detail with your son or daughter prior to paying the deposit to ensure that as a family you are all fully committed to the trip as this is a significant undertaking.

School trips including residential visits form an important part of the curriculum offered at St Aidan's. When accompanying children on a school trip, staff are acting *in loco parentis* just as they do in school. However, trips away from the normal school environment involve taking into account different routines and environments, which demand that students are able to show an increased level of responsibility and maturity. In order to participate in any trip, the school staff have to be confident that a student will be able to cope with the challenges that the trip presents.

Once the deadline of Monday 30 September 2019 has passed, we will look at the behaviour, attendance and the wellbeing of each student and decide whether they are able to cope with these demands of the trip. The decision to allow the students to participate will be taken between the Trip Leader and Senior Staff. If we decide the trip is not suitable for your son or daughter, we will inform you in writing and deposits in this case <u>will be refunded</u>.

Once a student has been accepted onto a trip if, in the time between gaining a place on the trip and the departure, there are concerns again about the student's participation on the trip we **reserve the right to** withdraw the student's place and any payments made may not be refunded.
