The report compares the data collected from your pupils with those from a larger, wider sample.

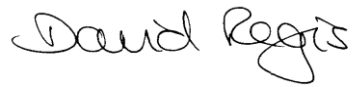

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Introduction

The Growing Up in North Yorkshire Survey, developed by the Schools Health Education Unit, is designed for young people of primary and secondary school age. This survey has been developed over 20 years, been used in over a thousand schools and been completed by many hundreds of thousands of school children. Data arising from the survey can be used to inform planning decisions, as well as in the classroom as the stimulus for discussion with young people.

This report contains several elements:

1. Results from this survey with explanation.
2. Quotes from the National Curriculum (2014), DfE PSHE Guidance (2013) and DfE 2016 Keeping Children Safe in Education.
3. Reference to the North Yorkshire Health and Wellbeing Award (Healthy Schools).
4. Additional notes drawn from a variety of other sources.

There are many aspects of the data in this report that will inform your school's needs analysis and evaluation of provision to promote the learning and wellbeing of children and young people, impacting on raising achievement and closing the achievement gap between disadvantaged pupils and their peers.

The National Curriculum states that:

“Every state-funded school must offer a curriculum which is balanced and broadly based and which promotes the spiritual, moral, cultural, mental and physical development of learners at the school and of society, and prepares pupils at the school for the opportunities, responsibilities and experiences of later life.

All schools should make provision for personal, social, health and economic education (PSHE), drawing on good practice.” (The National Curriculum in England Framework document, July 2014)

DfE Guidance Personal, social, health and economic (PSHE) education, September 2013 includes:

“Personal, social, health and economic (PSHE) education is an important and necessary part of all pupils' education. All schools should teach PSHE, drawing on good practice, and this expectation is outlined in the introduction to the proposed new national curriculum.

While we believe that it is for schools to tailor their local PSHE programme to reflect the needs of their pupils, we expect schools to use their PSHE education programme to equip pupils with a sound understanding of risk and with the knowledge and skills necessary to make safe and informed decisions.

Schools should seek to use PSHE education to build, where appropriate, on the statutory content already outlined in the national curriculum, the basic school curriculum and in statutory guidance on: drug education, financial education, sex and relationship education (SRE) and the importance of physical activity and diet for a healthy lifestyle.”

This report provides data to inform safeguarding provision in your school. DfE April 2016 Keeping Children Safe in Education:

“Governing bodies and proprietors should ensure children are taught about safeguarding, including online, through teaching and learning opportunities, as part of providing a broad and balanced curriculum. This may include covering relevant issues through personal, social, health and economic education (PSHE), tutorials (in FE colleges) and/or – for maintained schools and colleges- through sex and relationships education (SRE).”

Please note that 5 (305) pupil(s) didn't specify whether they are a boy or a girl and 0 (0) didn't specify what year group they are in. These pupils will not be included in any tables or charts which are split by sex or year respectively, however they will be included in any total figures.

If the sample you sent to Exeter for analysis was small, then it may have been aggregated by sex or year, or merged with a sample from another school or schools. This is done so that the figures are not too influenced by the behaviour of any one individual, and to ensure that the anonymity of the respondents is not compromised. If you would like to discuss this in more detail, please contact the Unit directly.

In the report, you may see '-' in the tables or text (e.g. '-%').

This means we have suppressed the result because the number of valid responses for an item has dropped below 6 pupils. This may happen part-way through the report, if children start but don't complete the questionnaire for some reason.

Background

ETHNICITY

- 88% (87%) of pupils responded that they are White British.

RELIGION

- 53% (19%) of pupils responded that they have a religion, faith or belief which is important to them, while 20% (16%) said they are 'not sure' if they do and 1% (2%) didn't want to say.
- 59% (23%) of pupils responded that they are Christian, while 2% (1%) said they are Muslim and 4% (8%) said they either 'don't know' what religion, faith or belief they have, or 'don't want to say'.

HOME LIFE

- 33% (32%) of pupils responded that at least 5 people live in their home (including themselves); 0% (1%) said at least 8 people do.
- 68% (50%) of pupils responded that there are at least 4 bedrooms in their home, while 4% (7%) said their home has 1 or 2 bedrooms.
- 9% (15%) of pupils live in a home where at least 2 more people live than there are actual numbers of bedrooms.
- 82% (67%) of pupils responded that they live with their Mum and Dad together.
- 7% (13%) of pupils responded that they live 'mainly or only' with their Mum, while 0% (1%) said they live 'mainly or only' with their Dad.

SPECIAL NEEDS

- 9% (7%) of pupils responded that they have a special educational need or learning difficulty, while 10% (11%) said they are 'not sure' if they have.
- 10% (12%) of pupils responded that they are disabled or have a long-standing illness, while 5% (7%) said they are 'not sure' if they have.
- 18% (17%) of pupils responded that they have a special educational need/learning difficulty or are disabled or have a long-standing illness, while 11% (13%) said they are 'not sure' if they have.
- 1% (1%) of pupils responded that they spend part of their school week learning at another school or centre, while 1% (1%) said they are 'not sure' if they do.

YOUNG CARERS

- 2% (4%) of pupils responded that they are a 'young carer', while 1% (3%) said they are 'not sure' if they are.
- 0% (2%) of pupils responded that being a young carer takes up at least an hour of their time each day, while 1% (1%) said it takes up less than an hour.
- Of the 6 (379) pupils who said they are a 'young carer', 18% (13%) said their school knows they are, while 36% (37%) said they are 'not sure' if it does.

FREE SCHOOL MEALS

- 4% (7%) of pupils responded that they get free school meals or vouchers for free meals, while 5% (4%) said they are 'not sure' if they do.

Enjoying and Achieving

SCHOOL

- 45% (42%) of pupils responded that they have changed schools at least twice since their 5th birthday; 3% (4%) said they have at least 5 times.
- 95% (95%) of pupils responded that they attended school on 5 days in the week before the survey.

ENJOYMENT

- 57% (39%) of pupils responded that they enjoy 'most' or 'all' of their lessons at school.
- 8% (16%) of pupils responded that they enjoy 'hardly any' of their lessons at school.
- 35% (39%) of pupils responded that they worry about exams and tests 'often' or 'all the time'; 27% (26%) said they worry about school-work problems.

ATTENDANCE

- 52% (44%) of pupils responded that they weren't absent from school in the month before the survey, while 30% (35%) said they have missed school due to illness or injury and 19% (23%) have been away due to medical/dental appointments.

SCHOOL

- 79% (65%) of pupils responded that adults at school talk to them about how to improve their work and 55% (36%) said their teachers realise when they don't understand.
- 71% (52%) of pupils responded that they have the opportunity to use things they have learnt in different situations and 58% (46%) said that sometimes they have a choice of different ways to learn about something.

SCHOOL LESSONS

- ❑ 29% (36%) of pupils responded that they have found school lessons about emotional health and wellbeing 'quite' or 'very' useful; 43% (34%) said the same of school lessons about citizenship.
- ❑ 3% (10%) of pupils responded that they have found school lessons about prejudice, discrimination and bullying 'not at all' useful; 8% (14%) said the same of school lessons about emotional health and wellbeing.

LEISURE TIME

- ❑ 80% (86%) of pupils responded that they spent time watching TV, DVDs or online videos after school on the day before the survey, while 75% (67%) did homework, 45% (49%) played computer games and 87% (92%) used the Internet on a computer, phone or other device.

SLEEPING PATTERNS

- ❑ 4% (7%) of pupils responded that they got five or fewer hours' sleep the night before the survey.
- ❑ 78% (72%) of pupils responded that they got at least eight hours' sleep the night before the survey.

Economic Wellbeing

FUTURE PLANS

- ❑ 56% (39%) of boys and 70% (50%) of girls responded that they want to continue in full-time education at the end of Year 11.
- ❑ 38% (48%) of boys and 25% (45%) of girls responded that they want to find a job as soon as they can at the end of Year 11.
- ❑ 35% (50%) of boys and 25% (43%) of girls responded that they want to get training for a skilled job or get an apprenticeship at the end of Year 11.
- ❑ 9% (22%) of boys and 14% (18%) of girls responded that they want to start a family at the end of Year 11.
- ❑ 67% (52%) of pupils responded that they intend to apply for University in the future, while 26% (34%) said they are 'not sure' if they will.
- ❑ 19% (22%) of pupils responded that they have had enough information and guidance about their options after Year 11, including apprenticeships.
- ❑ 55% (50%) of pupils responded that they haven't had enough information and guidance about their options after Year 11, including apprenticeships.
- ❑ 46% (42%) of pupils responded that they haven't had enough information and guidance about their options after Year 11 and would like to know more about work and employment, while 47% (40%) would like to know more about University.
- ❑ 38% (44%) of pupils responded that they have found school lessons about careers education 'quite' or 'very' useful, while 11% (11%) have found them 'not at all' useful and 17% (20%) couldn't remember any.

MONEY

- ❑ 18% (24%) of pupils responded that they have a regular paid job outside school during term-time.

- ❑ Of the 34 (1807) pupils who have a regular paid job, they spent an average of 6 (7) hours working in the week before the survey.
- ❑ 14% (14%) of pupils responded that they worry about money problems 'often' or 'all the time'.

VOLUNTEERING

- ❑ 68% (52%) of pupils responded that they have taken part in volunteering at some point outside of school in the last six months.
- ❑ 36% (27%) of pupils responded that they have taken part in volunteering at least 'once a month' outside of school in the last six months; 18% (14%) said they have done so 'at least once a week'.

Safety

FEELING SAFE AND HAPPY

- ❑ 93% (89%) of pupils responded that they 'always' feel safe at home and 79% (57%) said they 'always' feel safe at school.

ACCIDENTS

- ❑ 33% (40%) of pupils responded that they have had at least one accident or injury which was treated at a clinic or hospital in the last 12 months, while 12% (20%) said they have had more than one accident or injury which needed treatment.
- ❑ 24% (21%) of pupils responded that they have had an accident or injury in the last 12 months, the most recent of which was a sports injury, while 5% (7%) said they had a fall, trip or slip.

ANTI-SOCIAL BEHAVIOUR

- ❑ 55% (59%) of boys and 31% (46%) of girls responded that they have done at least one of the anti-social behaviours listed at some point; 9% (12%) said they have done four or more.

VIOLENCE AND AGGRESSION

- ❑ 5% (8%) of pupils responded that they have been the victim of violence or aggression in the area where they live in the last 12 months, while 7% (10%) said they are 'not sure' if they have been.
- ❑ 4% (8%) of pupils responded that they have carried weapons or something else for protection when going out at least 'sometimes'.
- ❑ 2% (3%) of pupils responded that they have carried weapons or something else for protection when going out at night.

BULLYING

- ❑ 25% (28%) of pupils responded that they were pushed/hit in the month before the survey and 12% (13%) said they had belongings taken/broken. 43% (40%) said none of these things happened to them.
- ❑ 14% (22%) of pupils responded that they experienced negative behaviour outside at school during breaktimes in the month before the survey; 12% (17%) said they experienced such behaviour during lesson time.

- ❑ 13% (22%) of pupils responded that they have been bullied at or near school in the last 12 months, while 18% (15%) said they are 'not sure' if they have been.
- ❑ 12% (15%) of boys and 13% (19%) of girls think they are being picked on or bullied because of their size or weight.
- ❑ 16% (17%) of boys and 20% (27%) of girls think they are being picked on or bullied because of the way they look.
- ❑ 60% (45%) of pupils responded that their school deals with bullying 'quite' or 'very' well, while 7% (2%) said that bullying is not a problem in their school.
- ❑ 5% (15%) of pupils responded that their school deals with bullying 'badly'.
- ❑ 50% (51%) of pupils responded that they have found school lessons about prejudice, discrimination and bullying 'quite' or 'very' useful, while 3% (10%) have found them 'not at all' useful and 14% (11%) couldn't remember any.

INTERNET SAFETY

- ❑ 96% (93%) of pupils responded that they communicate with friends and family they know in real life online.
- ❑ 16% (18%) of pupils responded that they communicate with people they have met online and don't know in real life.
- ❑ 41% (38%) of pupils responded that they communicate with people through online games, while 52% (53%) said they do so through picture/video sharing sites/apps.
- ❑ 10% (14%) of pupils responded that they have experienced someone writing or showing them things online to hurt or upset them (with text, pictures or video), while 4% (6%) said they have sent personal information to someone, then wished they hadn't or had thought more about it.
- ❑ 12% (11%) of pupils responded that they worry about keeping safe on the Internet, email and using mobile phones 'often' or 'all the time'.

Making a Positive Contribution

Warwick-Edinburgh Mental Wellbeing Scale

- ❑ On average pupils scored 25 (23) on the SWEMWB Scale.
- ❑ 1% (6%) of pupils had a low score (7 – 13) on the SWEMWB Scale, while 18% (23%) had a med-low score (14 – 20).
- ❑ 33% (22%) of pupils had a high or maximum score (28 – 35) on the SWEMWB Scale.
- ❑ 47% (37%) of pupils responded that they have at least 'often' been feeling optimistic about the future and 38% (35%) said they have been feeling useful.

RESILIENCE

- ❑ 17% (36%) of pupils had a low measure of resilience (0 – 19).

- ❑ 26% (20%) of pupils had a high measure of resilience (26+).
- ❑ 58% (48%) of pupils responded that when something goes wrong they 'usually' or 'always' learn from it for next time, while 20% (27%) said they get angry or upset and feel bad for ages.
- ❑ 64% (56%) of pupils responded that if at first they don't succeed, they 'usually' or 'always' keep on trying until they do, while 46% (44%) ask for help and 7% (13%) give up.

VIEWS AND OPINIONS

- ❑ 63% (56%) of pupils responded that they are asked for their opinions about what they learn in school; 43% (41%) said their opinions make a difference.
- ❑ 49% (48%) of pupils responded that they are asked for their opinions about how they learn in school; 48% (45%) said their opinions make a difference.
- ❑ 52% (48%) of pupils responded that they are asked for their opinions about the school environment; 54% (48%) said their opinions make a difference.
- ❑ 38% (31%) of pupils responded that they are asked for their opinions about their community; 46% (37%) said their opinions make a difference.
- ❑ 26% (43%) of pupils responded that they have had the chance to vote for School/College Council members and 46% (31%) said they have had the chance to take part in a mock general election.

Healthy Eating

LUNCH

- ❑ 6% (6%) of pupils responded that they didn't have anything to eat or drink for lunch on the day before the survey.
- ❑ 84% (85%) of pupils responded that they had something to drink for lunch on the day before the survey.
- ❑ 91% (88%) of pupils responded that they had something to eat for lunch on the day before the survey.

BREAKFAST

- ❑ 10% (14%) of pupils responded that they didn't have anything to eat or drink before lessons on the morning of the survey.
- ❑ 77% (71%) of pupils responded that they had something to drink before lessons on the morning of the survey.
- ❑ 82% (73%) of pupils responded that they had something to eat before lessons on the morning of the survey.

5-A-DAY

- ❑ 4% (9%) of pupils responded that they didn't eat any portions of fruit or vegetables on the day before the survey.
- ❑ 29% (20%) of pupils responded that they ate at least 5 portions of fruit and vegetables on the day before the survey.

SNACKS AND FIZZY DRINKS

- ❑ 12% (10%) of pupils responded that they didn't eat any snacks on the day before the survey.
- ❑ 6% (10%) of pupils responded that they ate at least 5 snacks on the day before the survey.
- ❑ 70% (54%) of pupils responded that they didn't drink any fizzy drinks or energy drinks on the day before the survey.
- ❑ 1% (2%) of pupils responded that they drank at least 5 fizzy drinks and/or energy drinks on the day before the survey.

DIETING

- ❑ 20% (26%) of pupils responded that they never worry about how much they eat.
- ❑ 13% (16%) of pupils responded that they try to lose weight a couple of times a year.
- ❑ 12% (12%) of pupils responded that they are 'often on a diet, or at least being careful not to eat too much'.
- ❑ 1% (3%) of pupils responded that they are 'always on a diet'.
- ❑ 3% (8%) of pupils responded that they have dieted to an extreme degree in the past, with a further 2% (2%) doing so in the current term.
- ❑ 14% (17%) of pupils responded that they have done an unusual amount of exercise to lose weight in the past, with a further 5% (6%) doing so in the current term.
- ❑ 28% (31%) of pupils responded that they worry about the way they look 'often' or 'all the time'.

WATER

- ❑ 92% (78%) of pupils responded that they can get water at school, while 8% (20%) said 'not easily'.

Physical Activity

EXERCISE

- ❑ 1% (2%) of pupils responded that they don't do a single hour of physical activity in a typical week in and out of school.
- ❑ 71% (49%) of pupils responded that they do five or more hours of physical activity in a typical week in and out of school.
- ❑ 8% (9%) of pupils responded that they find it 'not at all' easy to be as physically active as they like.
- ❑ 77% (66%) of pupils responded that they find it 'quite' or 'very' easy to be as physically active as they like.
- ❑ 9% (13%) of pupils responded that they don't enjoy team sport at all.
- ❑ 76% (64%) of pupils responded that they enjoy team sport 'quite a lot' or 'a lot'.
- ❑ 9% (18%) of pupils responded that they don't enjoy individual sport at all.

- ❑ 66% (53%) of pupils responded that they enjoy individual sport 'quite a lot' or 'a lot'.
- ❑ 7% (11%) of pupils responded that they don't enjoy general physical activity at all.
- ❑ 67% (57%) of pupils responded that they enjoy general physical activity 'quite a lot' or 'a lot'.

Alcohol, Tobacco and Drugs

ALCOHOL

- ❑ 57% (48%) of pupils responded that they 'never' drink alcohol, while 3% (5%) said they do not drink alcohol at home.
- ❑ 27% (32%) of pupils responded that they drink alcohol at home and their parents 'always' know, while 7% (8%) said their parents 'usually' know.
- ❑ Of the 112 (4043) pupils who drink alcohol at home, 69% (68%) said their parents 'always' know, while 17% (18%) said they 'usually' do.
- ❑ 6% (7%) of pupils responded that they drink alcohol at home and their parents 'never' or only 'sometimes' know.
- ❑ Of the pupils who drink alcohol at home, 14% (15%) said their parents 'never' or only 'sometimes' know.
- ❑ 15% (21%) of pupils responded that they had an alcoholic drink in the 7 days before the survey.
- ❑ 11% (15%) of pupils responded that they were given alcohol by their parents or relatives in the 7 days before the survey, while 3% (4%) said they were given it by friends.
- ❑ 42% (47%) of pupils responded that they have found school lessons about alcohol 'quite' or 'very' useful, while 11% (13%) have found them 'not at all' useful and 19% (14%) couldn't remember any.

SMOKING

- ❑ 13% (18%) of pupils responded that they have smoked in the past or smoke now.
- ❑ 0% (3%) of pupils responded that they smoke 'regularly'.
- ❑ 0% (4%) of pupils responded that they are an occasional/regular smoker and smoked in the 7 days before the survey.
- ❑ 16% (28%) of pupils responded that someone smoked cigarettes/cigars in the same room that they were in at least 'once or twice a month' in the past year; 5% (18%) said they did so at least 'once or twice a week'.
- ❑ 3% (10%) of pupils responded that someone smoked cigarettes/cigars in the same car that they were in at least 'once or twice a month' in the past year; 2% (6%) said they did so at least 'once or twice a week'.
- ❑ 43% (49%) of pupils responded that they have found school lessons about smoking 'quite' or 'very' useful, while 10% (12%) have found them 'not at all' useful and 20% (14%) couldn't remember any.

- ❑ 20% (28%) of pupils responded that they have at least tried electronic cigarettes, while 2% (4%) said they use one 'regularly' (at least once a week).

DRUGS

- ❑ 14% (18%) of pupils responded that they have been offered cannabis, while 3% (3%) said they are 'not sure' if they have.
- ❑ 7% (8%) of pupils responded that they have been offered other drugs (not cannabis), while 2% (4%) said they are 'not sure' if they have.
- ❑ 5% (7%) of pupils responded that they have been offered cannabis or other drugs by a friend.
- ❑ 5% (7%) of pupils responded that they have been offered cannabis or other drugs while hanging about outside (e.g. on the street, at a park), while 3% (4%) said they have at a party.
- ❑ 15% (10%) of pupils reported that they have taken at least one of the drugs listed in the questionnaire.
- ❑ 6% (4%) of pupils responded that they have taken at least one of the drugs listed during the last month.
- ❑ 12% (7%) of pupils responded that they have taken at least one of the drugs listed during the last year; 1% (1%) said they have taken a drug in Q77, but did not provide any detail in Q78.
- ❑ 7% (4%) of pupils responded that they have taken drugs and alcohol on the same occasion, while 1% (1%) said they are 'not sure' if they have.
- ❑ This works out as 43% (36%) of pupils who have taken drugs responding that they have taken drugs and alcohol on the same occasion.

Sexual Health

CONTRACEPTION

- ❑ 31% (27%) of pupils responded that they know where they can get condoms free of charge.

SEXUAL ORIENTATION

- ❑ 91% (85%) of pupils responded that they are heterosexual.
- ❑ 0% (2%) of pupils responded that they are gay/lesbian, while 3% (5%) said they are bisexual.
- ❑ 2% (3%) of pupils responded that they worry about being different because of their sexuality 'often' or 'all the time'.

YEAR 10: SEXUAL RELATIONSHIPS

- ❑ 16% (19%) of Year 10 + pupils responded that they are either in a sexual relationship or have had one in the past.
- ❑ 71% (49%) of the 14 (628) Year 10 pupils who have had sex responded that they have had sex and always used a method of protection or contraception; 7% (9%) said they are 'not sure' if they did.
- ❑ 0% (17%) of the 14 (628) Year 10 pupils who have had sex responded that they have taken risks with sex (infection or pregnancy) after drinking alcohol or

drug use; 0% (12%) said they are 'not sure' if they have.

- ❑ 6% (9%) of Year 10 pupils responded that their boyfriend/girlfriend has threatened to tell people things about them, either with their current partner or in the past; 6% (12%) said their boyfriend/girlfriend has used hurtful or threatening language towards them.
- ❑ 59% (49%) of Year 10 pupils responded that if any of the things in Q96 happened to them, they would look after themselves without help; 16% (20%) said they wouldn't.
- ❑ 67% (57%) of Year 10 pupils responded that if any of the things in Q96 happened to them, they know where to get help; 14% (17%) said they don't.

Emotional Health & Well-being

WORRYING

- ❑ 60% (64%) of pupils responded that they worry about at least one of the issues listed 'often' or 'all of the time'.
- ❑ 15% (17%) of pupils responded that they worry about relationships 'often' or 'all of the time', while 19% (22%) said they worry about problems with friends.
- ❑ 79% (74%) of pupils responded that they know an adult they trust who they can talk to if they are worried about something, while 14% (16%) said they 'maybe' do.
- ❑ 53% (43%) of pupils responded that if they would like more information about any of the issues in Q82, they would like to get it from their parents/carers, while 4% (4%) said they would like the information from school lessons and 6% (7%) would like to find out on the internet.
- ❑ 57% (46%) of pupils responded that they talk to someone if they have a problem or feel stressed, while 38% (36%) said they listen to music and 15% (18%) said they do nothing.

ARMED FORCES

- ❑ 3% (5%) of pupils responded that they have a parent/carer who is in the British Army, Royal Navy, Royal Air Force or the Reserves, while 2% (6%) said they are 'not sure' if they do.
- ❑ 0% (2%) of pupils responded that they worry 'quite a lot' or 'a lot' about their parent/carer when they are away on military operations.
- ❑ Of the 7 (430) pupils who have a parent/carer in the armed forces, 14% (35%) worry about them 'quite a lot' or 'a lot' when they are away on operations.
- ❑ 0% (0%) of pupils responded that they would find it useful to have a counsellor to talk to about their worries about their parent/carer in the armed forces, while 0% (1%) said they 'don't know' if they would find it useful.

Significant Differences

Where differences can be seen between your school and the reference sample, you may find the enclosed table of some use in deciding if the differences seen are significant. The 'standard error' of a proportion is an assessment of how reliable our figures are, that is, the margin of error.

Two points in particular should be made:

1. when the sample size is small, it may be that just one individual voting a different way would make a large percentage difference to the results (so, one in twenty is 5%)
2. even if your sample is small, you may have a very high proportion of your available population – if, say, you sample every single pupil of your year 8 class. In this case, the notion of 'margin of error' doesn't really apply to the sampling, only to the process of collecting the responses.

So, if you have a sample of 50 students and 30% of them think that the school needs a new swimming pool, we can see from the table that standard error of the percentage is about $\pm 6.5\%$.

- ❑ 56% (63%) of pupils responded that if at first they don't succeed, they 'usually' or 'always' keep on trying until they do, while 45% (44%) ask for help and 9% (7%) give up.

VIEWS AND OPINIONS

- ❑ 52% (61%) of pupils responded that they are asked for their opinions about what they learn in school; 36% (41%) said their opinions make a difference.
- ❑ 39% (50%) of pupils responded that they are asked for their opinions about how they learn in school; 43% (52%) said their opinions make a difference.
- ❑ 47% (55%) of pupils responded that they are asked for their opinions about the school environment; 48% (54%) said their opinions make a difference.
- ❑ 31% (40%) of pupils responded that they are asked for their opinions about their community; 43% (44%) said their opinions make a difference.
- ❑ 27% (36%) of pupils responded that they have had the chance to vote for School/College Council members and 66% (91%) said they have had the chance to take part in a mock general election.

Healthy Eating

LUNCH

- ❑ 8% (2%) of pupils responded that they didn't have anything to eat or drink for lunch on the day before the survey.
- ❑ 78% (86%) of pupils responded that they had something to drink for lunch on the day before the survey.
- ❑ 89% (97%) of pupils responded that they had something to eat for lunch on the day before the survey.

BREAKFAST

- ❑ 14% (10%) of pupils responded that they didn't have anything to eat or drink before lessons on the morning of the survey.
- ❑ 74% (75%) of pupils responded that they had something to drink before lessons on the morning of the survey.
- ❑ 79% (82%) of pupils responded that they had something to eat before lessons on the morning of the survey.

5-A-DAY

- ❑ 5% (4%) of pupils responded that they didn't eat any portions of fruit or vegetables on the day before the survey.
- ❑ 25% (28%) of pupils responded that they ate at least 5 portions of fruit and vegetables on the day before the survey.

SNACKS AND FIZZY DRINKS

- ❑ 11% (12%) of pupils responded that they didn't eat any snacks on the day before the survey.
- ❑ 8% (8%) of pupils responded that they ate at least 5 snacks on the day before the survey.
- ❑ 63% (66%) of pupils responded that they didn't drink any fizzy drinks or energy drinks on the day before the survey.
- ❑ 2% (1%) of pupils responded that they drank at least 5 fizzy drinks and/or energy drinks on the day before the survey.

DIETING

- ❑ 22% (24%) of pupils responded that they never worry about how much they eat.
- ❑ 16% (15%) of pupils responded that they try to lose weight a couple of times a year.
- ❑ 14% (12%) of pupils responded that they are 'often on a diet, or at least being careful not to eat too much'.
- ❑ 2% (2%) of pupils responded that they are 'always on a diet'.
- ❑ 5% (5%) of pupils responded that they have dieted to an extreme degree in the past, with a further 4% (2%) doing so in the current term.
- ❑ 20% (15%) of pupils responded that they have done an unusual amount of exercise to lose weight in the past, with a further 4% (6%) doing so in the current term.
- ❑ 36% (34%) of pupils responded that they worry about the way they look 'often' or 'all the time'.

WATER

- ❑ 92% (90%) of pupils responded that they can get water at school, while 8% (9%) said 'not easily'.

Physical Activity

EXERCISE

- ❑ 1% (0%) of pupils responded that they don't do a single hour of physical activity in a typical week in and out of school.
- ❑ 67% (68%) of pupils responded that they do five or more hours of physical activity in a typical week in and out of school.
- ❑ 11% (7%) of pupils responded that they find it 'not at all' easy to be as physically active as they like.
- ❑ 75% (76%) of pupils responded that they find it 'quite' or 'very' easy to be as physically active as they like.
- ❑ 11% (9%) of pupils responded that they don't enjoy team sport at all.
- ❑ 69% (75%) of pupils responded that they enjoy team sport 'quite a lot' or 'a lot'.
- ❑ 12% (12%) of pupils responded that they don't enjoy individual sport at all.

- ❑ 68% (66%) of pupils responded that they enjoy individual sport 'quite a lot' or 'a lot'.
- ❑ 8% (7%) of pupils responded that they don't enjoy general physical activity at all.
- ❑ 65% (63%) of pupils responded that they enjoy general physical activity 'quite a lot' or 'a lot'.

Alcohol, Tobacco and Drugs

ALCOHOL

- ❑ 47% (49%) of pupils responded that they 'never' drink alcohol, while 4% (6%) said they do not drink alcohol at home.
- ❑ 30% (29%) of pupils responded that they drink alcohol at home and their parents 'always' know, while 11% (9%) said their parents 'usually' know.
- ❑ Of the 86 (157) pupils who drink alcohol at home, 60% (64%) said their parents 'always' know, while 22% (20%) said they 'usually' do.
- ❑ 9% (7%) of pupils responded that they drink alcohol at home and their parents 'never' or only 'sometimes' know.
- ❑ Of the pupils who drink alcohol at home, 17% (16%) said their parents 'never' or only 'sometimes' know.
- ❑ 23% (19%) of pupils responded that they had an alcoholic drink in the 7 days before the survey.
- ❑ 16% (13%) of pupils responded that they were given alcohol by their parents or relatives in the 7 days before the survey, while 4% (3%) said they were given it by friends.
- ❑ 42% (53%) of pupils responded that they have found school lessons about alcohol 'quite' or 'very' useful, while 11% (9%) have found them 'not at all' useful and 19% (18%) couldn't remember any.

SMOKING

- ❑ 19% (15%) of pupils responded that they have smoked in the past or smoke now.
- ❑ 0% (1%) of pupils responded that they smoke 'regularly'.
- ❑ 0% (3%) of pupils responded that they are an occasional/regular smoker and smoked in the 7 days before the survey.
- ❑ 22% (21%) of pupils responded that someone smoked cigarettes/cigars in the same room that they were in at least 'once or twice a month' in the past year; 7% (8%) said they did so at least 'once or twice a week'.
- ❑ 4% (5%) of pupils responded that someone smoked cigarettes/cigars in the same car that they were in at least 'once or twice a month' in the past year; 2% (2%) said they did so at least 'once or twice a week'.
- ❑ 43% (53%) of pupils responded that they have found school lessons about smoking 'quite' or 'very' useful, while 10% (9%) have found them 'not at all' useful and 20% (19%) couldn't remember any.

- ❑ 29% (19%) of pupils responded that they have at least tried electronic cigarettes, while 3% (1%) said they use one 'regularly' (at least once a week).

DRUGS

- ❑ 22% (20%) of pupils responded that they have been offered cannabis, while 3% (4%) said they are 'not sure' if they have.
- ❑ 10% (6%) of pupils responded that they have been offered other drugs (not cannabis), while 2% (5%) said they are 'not sure' if they have.
- ❑ 8% (10%) of pupils responded that they have been offered cannabis or other drugs by a friend.
- ❑ 7% (10%) of pupils responded that they have been offered cannabis or other drugs while hanging about outside (e.g. on the street, at a park), while 4% (5%) said they have at a party.
- ❑ 15% (11%) of pupils reported that they have taken at least one of the drugs listed in the questionnaire.
- ❑ 6% (5%) of pupils responded that they have taken at least one of the drugs listed during the last month.
- ❑ 12% (8%) of pupils responded that they have taken at least one of the drugs listed during the last year; 1% (1%) said they have taken a drug in Q77, but did not provide any detail in Q78.
- ❑ 7% (4%) of pupils responded that they have taken drugs and alcohol on the same occasion, while 1% (1%) said they are 'not sure' if they have.
- ❑ This works out as 43% (33%) of pupils who have taken drugs responding that they have taken drugs and alcohol on the same occasion.

Sexual Health

CONTRACEPTION

- ❑ 31% (25%) of pupils responded that they know where they can get condoms free of charge.

SEXUAL ORIENTATION

- ❑ 91% (91%) of pupils responded that they are heterosexual.
- ❑ 0% (1%) of pupils responded that they are gay/lesbian, while 3% (3%) said they are bisexual.
- ❑ 2% (2%) of pupils responded that they worry about being different because of their sexuality 'often' or 'all the time'.

YEAR 10: SEXUAL RELATIONSHIPS

- ❑ 16% (8%) of Year 10+ pupils responded that they are either in a sexual relationship or have had one in the past.
- ❑ 71% (19%) of the 14 (15) Year 10 pupils who have had sex responded that they have had sex and always used a method of protection or contraception; 7% (13%) said they are 'not sure' if they did.

- ❑ 0% (18%) of the 14 (15) Year 10 pupils who have had sex responded that they have taken risks with sex (infection or pregnancy) after drinking alcohol or drug use; 0% (6%) said they are 'not sure' if they have.

- ❑ 6% (5%) of Year 10 pupils responded that their boyfriend/girlfriend has threatened to tell people things about them, either with their current partner or in the past; 6% (6%) said their boyfriend/girlfriend has used hurtful or threatening language towards them.
- ❑ 59% (42%) of Year 10 pupils responded that if any of the things in Q96 happened to them, they would look after themselves without help; 16% (26%) said they wouldn't.
- ❑ 67% (62%) of Year 10 pupils responded that if any of the things in Q96 happened to them, they know where to get help; 14% (18%) said they don't.

Emotional Health & Well-being

WORRYING

- ❑ 68% (68%) of pupils responded that they worry about at least one of the issues listed 'often' or 'all of the time'.
- ❑ 21% (20%) of pupils responded that they worry about relationships 'often' or 'all of the time', while 24% (18%) said they worry about problems with friends.
- ❑ 72% (73%) of pupils responded that they know an adult they trust who they can talk to if they are worried about something, while 17% (18%) said they 'maybe' do.
- ❑ 44% (44%) of pupils responded that if they would like more information about any of the issues in Q82, they would like to get it from their parents/carers, while 6% (5%) said they would like the information from school lessons and 7% (11%) would like to find out on the internet.
- ❑ 49% (54%) of pupils responded that they talk to someone if they have a problem or feel stressed, while 38% (41%) said they listen to music and 20% (14%) said they do nothing.

ARMED FORCES

- ❑ 2% (1%) of pupils responded that they have a parent/carer who is in the British Army, Royal Navy, Royal Air Force or the Reserves, while 2% (3%) said they are 'not sure' if they do.
- ❑ 0% (0%) of pupils responded that they worry 'quite a lot' or 'a lot' about their parent/carer when they are away on military operations.
- ❑ 0% (0%) of pupils responded that they would find it useful to have a counsellor to talk to about their worries about their parent/carer in the armed forces, while 0% (0%) said they 'don't know' if they would find it useful.

Guidance on using the 2018 data: *Growing up in North Yorkshire*

The following is collated from school responses and work with schools, as to how they have successfully used previous data to identify needs, respond to issues identified and develop provision.

School Self-Evaluation

- Many schools have used the data well as part of their self-evaluation processes. The data has provided useful evidence of impact of the schools' provision especially focussed on outcomes for pupils, and has been included in a number of different sections in a school's self-evaluation. Some schools have included a brief report to the governing body on the outcomes of the questionnaire informing school priorities. Questions in the 2018 Growing Up in North Yorkshire survey support the self-evaluation of the school's provision including effectiveness of leadership and management, quality of teaching, learning and assessment and personal development, behaviour and welfare, and are aligned to Ofsted judgements.

Policy review

- For some schools the data has informed policy review, for example, Relationships and Sex Education, substance misuse policies, Anti-Bullying and Online Safety policies and Pupil Premium Strategies.

Pupil Voice

- Where pupils reported not feeling listened to, this has led to changes in practice and review of mechanisms to gather pupil voice and implement responses. Some examples include; introducing comments boxes in classes for private questions/concerns and follow-up pupil questionnaires.
- Some schools have developed more focussed follow-up through, for example, by sharing the key data with their school councils, on specific issues arising through the data and working with the pupils to bring about change to ensure the outcomes are more positive for the pupils.

Emerging Issues

- Many schools highlighted concerns about Internet use and the need to develop work around cyber bullying and online safety.
- Pupil responses highlighted a number of gender differences regarding a range of different issues which informed school-based planning.
- Schools have identified the need to support pupils' emotional wellbeing and resilience and a number of schools have had specific projects focussed on these aspects. This includes the work of schools on the coast and in Ryedale who have implemented a targeted academic resilience project.
- As a result of feedback on transition experiences some schools have revisited their transition programmes and put in specific additional transition activities, for example, inviting Year 7 pupils to talk with Year 6 pupils.
- The data have informed the further development of Careers Guidance programmes.

Curriculum Development

- As a result of the feedback from the data, many schools have reviewed their Relationships and Sex Education (RSE) provision. Many primary schools have now implemented an RSE curriculum that starts in Year 1, includes conception in Year 6 and ensures a range of safeguarding aspects are covered.
- Secondary schools have ensured their RSE curriculum is more LGBT inclusive and makes the links for pupils between online safety and RSE education.
- Schools could more effectively use the data to review their relationships and sex education and health education curriculum as it is becoming statutory for all schools in September 2020. The data enable schools to implement a curriculum based on the needs of their pupils.

Additional Provision

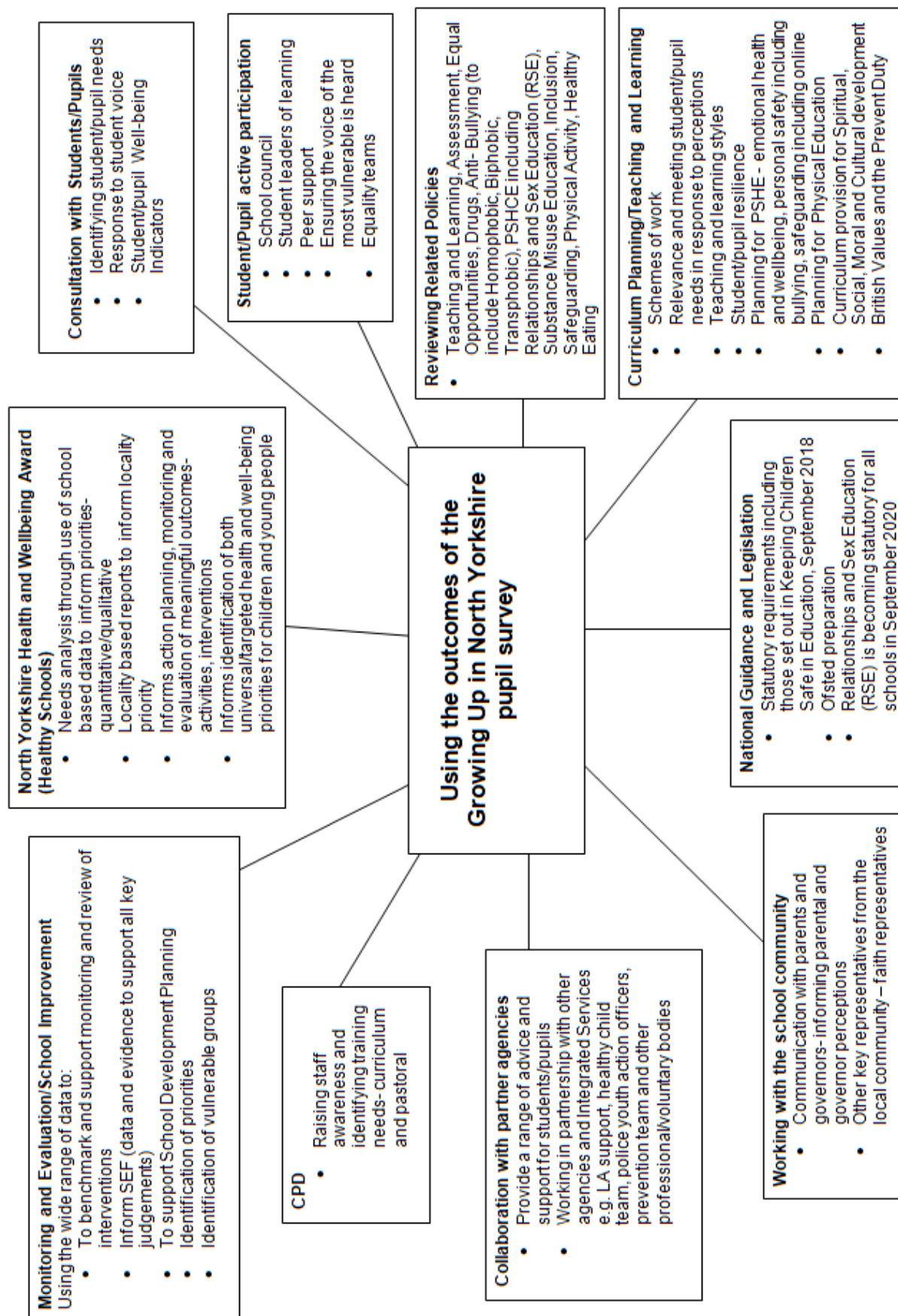
- Some schools have chosen to develop nurture groups.
- A number of schools have set up specific intervention groups for pupils engaged in some aspects of risky behaviours based on emerging issues for school data, for example, a Year 10 intervention group for a small group of boys engaged in substance misuse. Another school established an intervention group for a small number of Year 8 pupils in relation to alcohol use. Use of the data informed a 'normative' approach to ensure that some perceptions of pupils were able to be challenged.
- Pupil responses have provided many schools with a greater insight into pupil home life and background, providing valuable data to inform needs analysis.
- Further extended schools provision has been enhanced as data has been used to inform schools where there are gaps, particularly with regard to clubs involving physical activity.
- A number of breakfast clubs have been set up in response to data.

Working with Parents

- Cooking clubs have emerged as a popular choice for schools, providing education for pupils and parents.
- Forums for parents regarding emerging issues such as online safety have been developed as a result of pupils' responses. Sharing relevant data with parents has been helpful in informing parents about the risks and ensuring a more partnership approach between parents and school.

Continuing Professional Development (CPD)

- The data from the 2018 survey will be used to identify the CPD requirements for staff development to increase the expertise and confidence in developing the effective provision that will be needed to meet the requirements of the relationships and sex education and health education curriculum that will become statutory for all schools in September 2020.

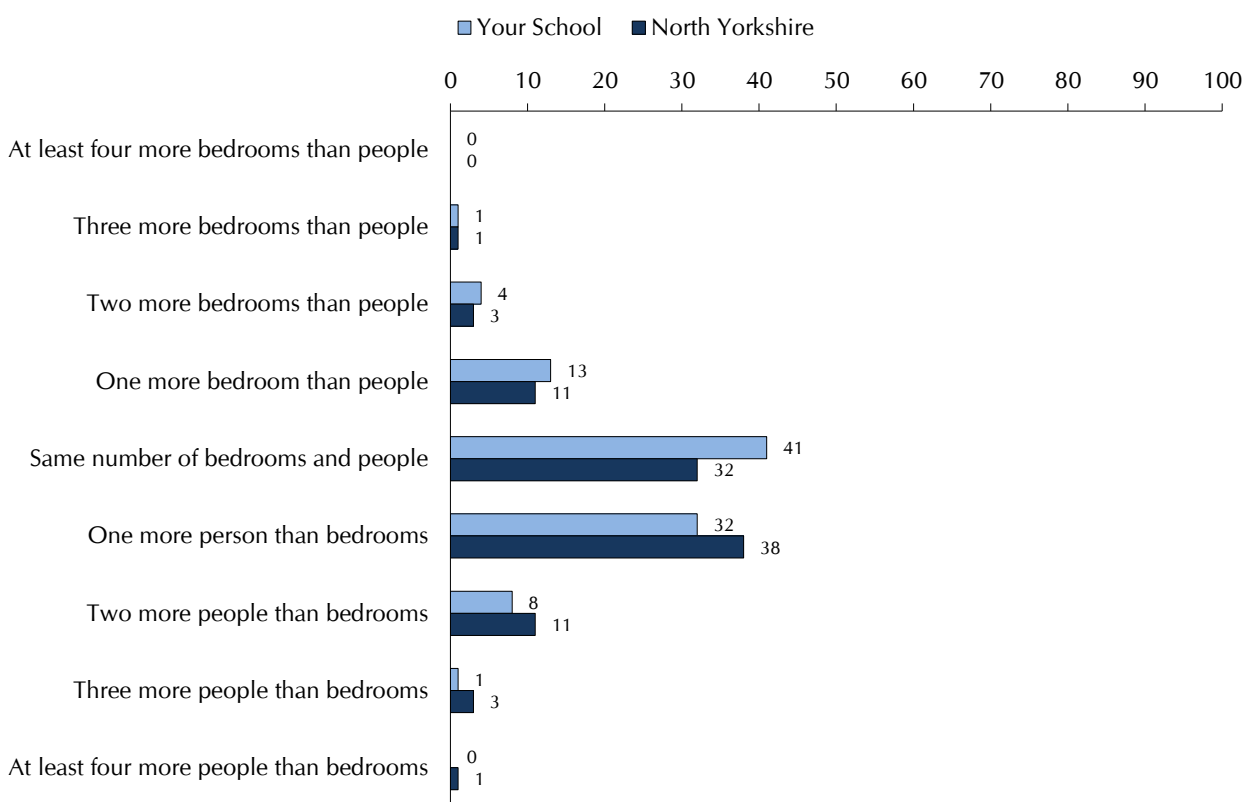

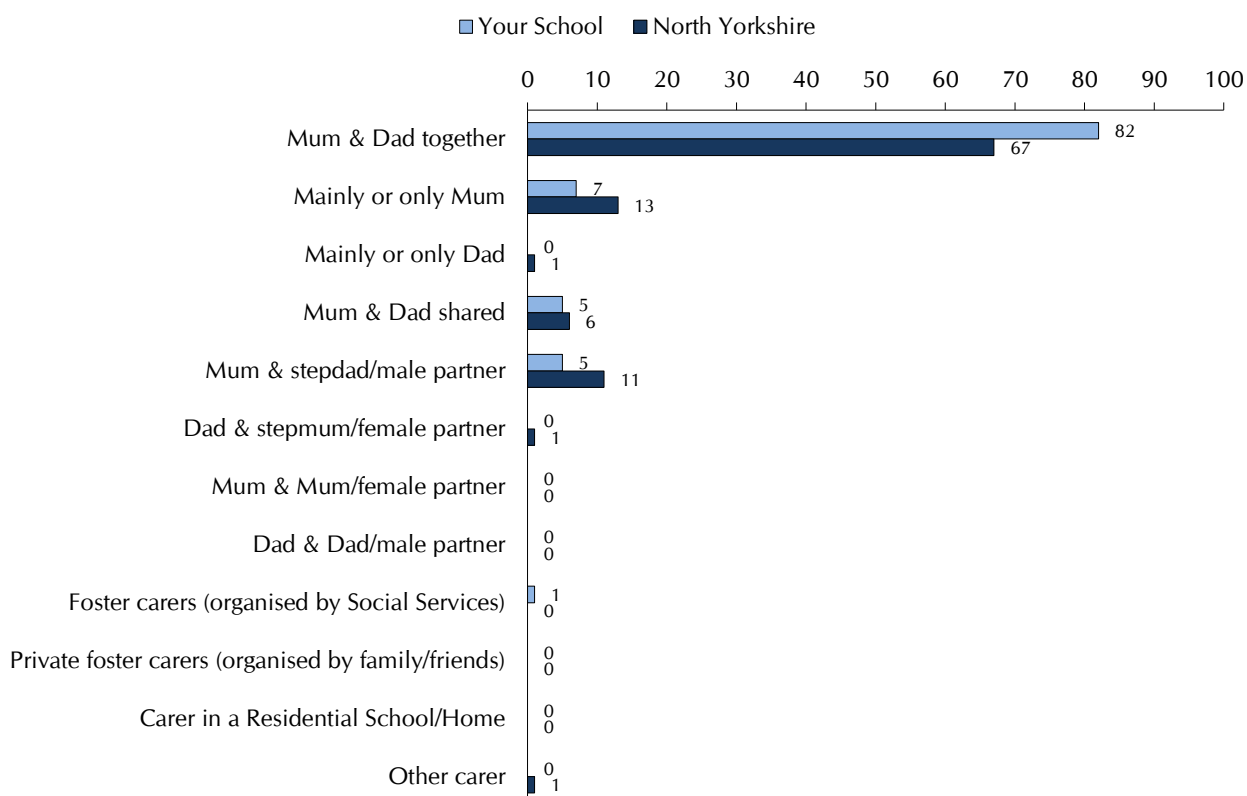

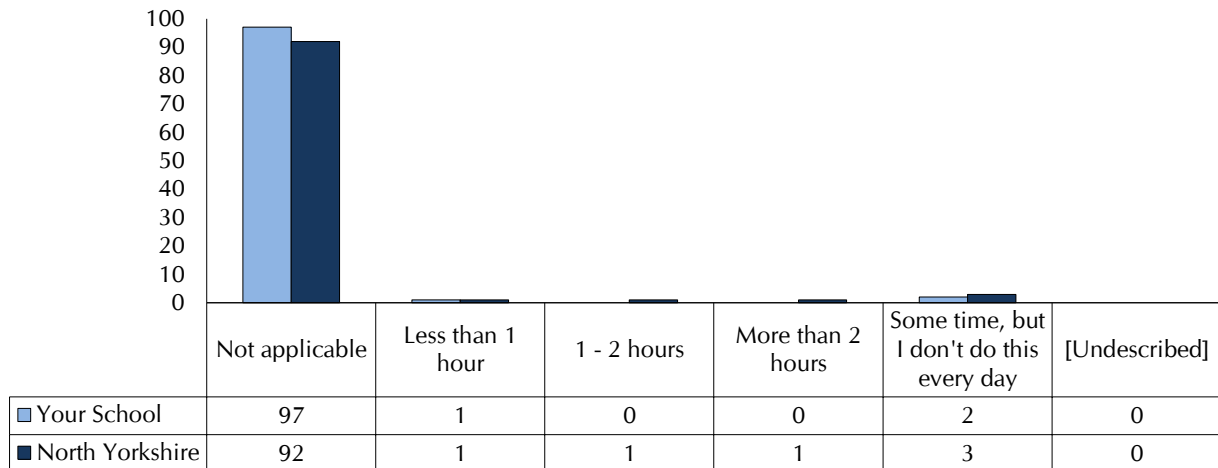

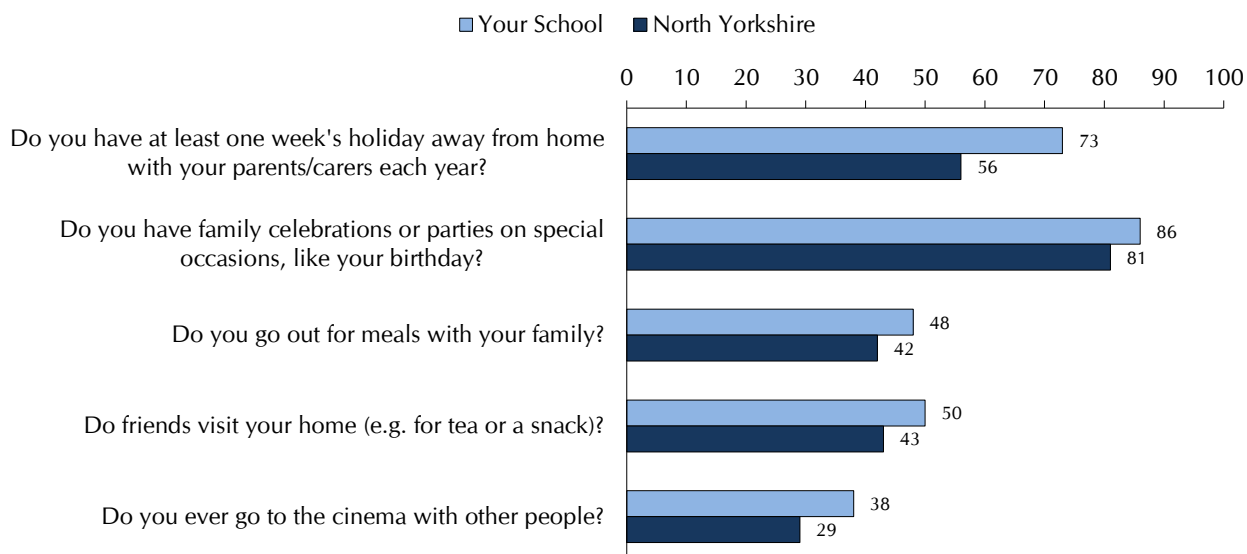

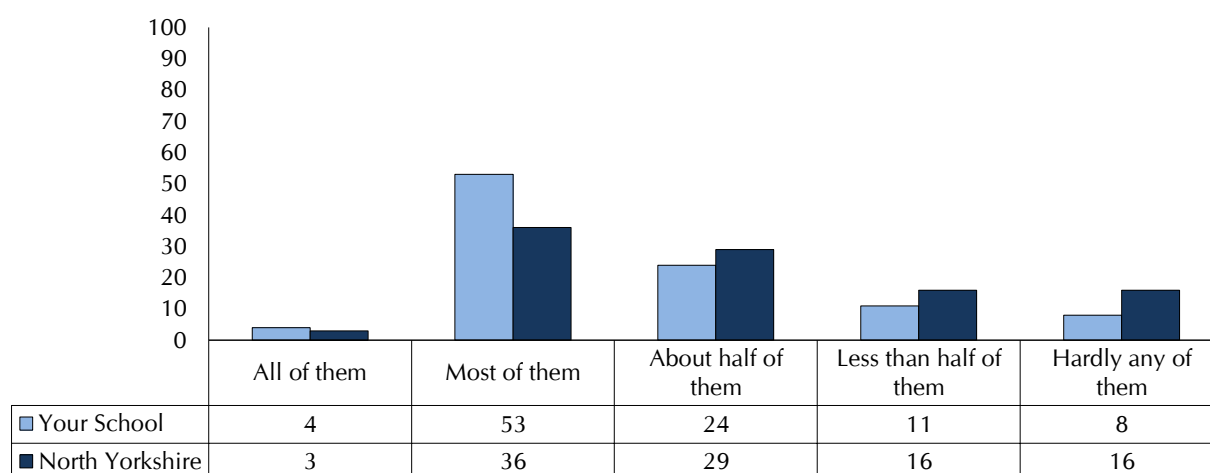

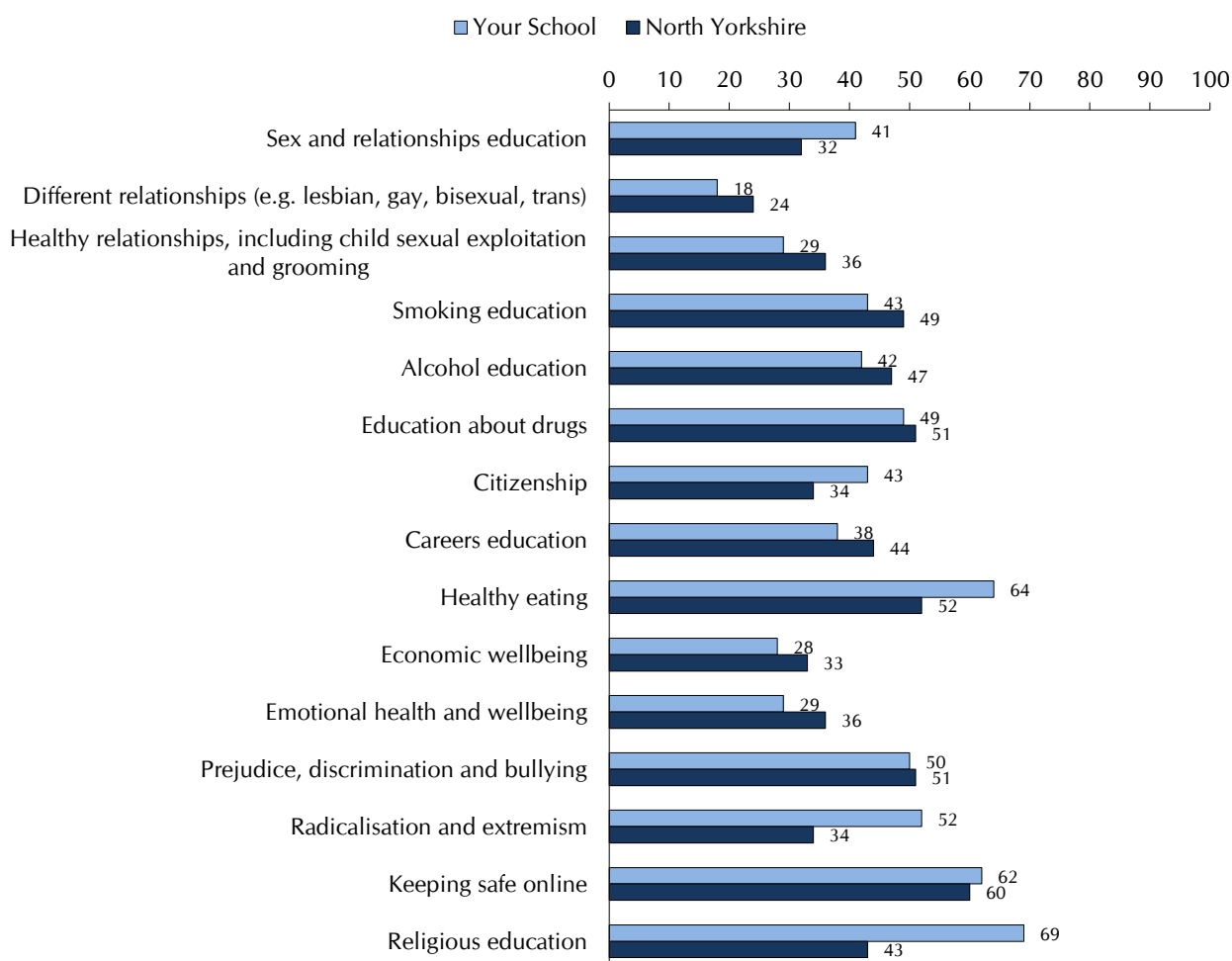

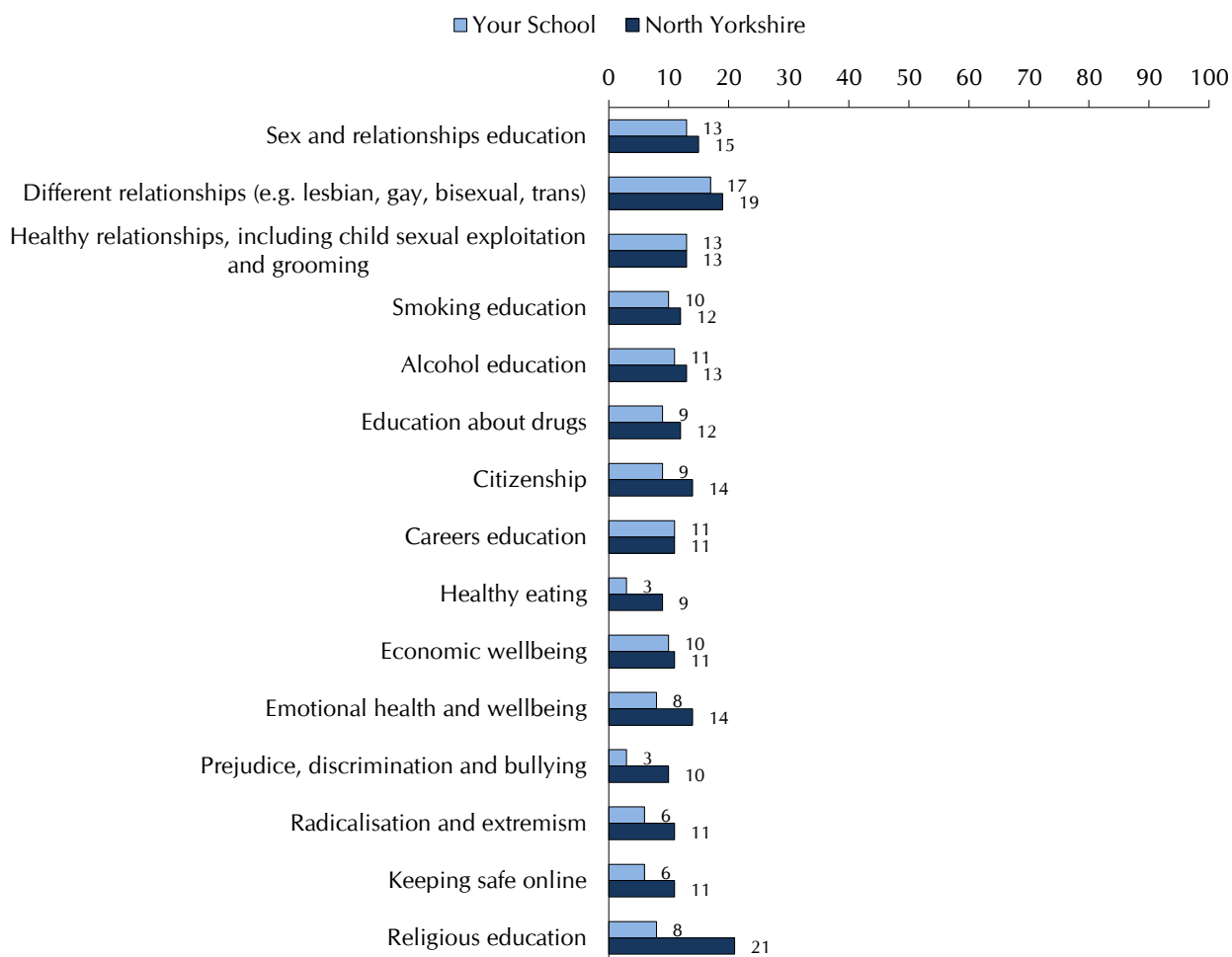

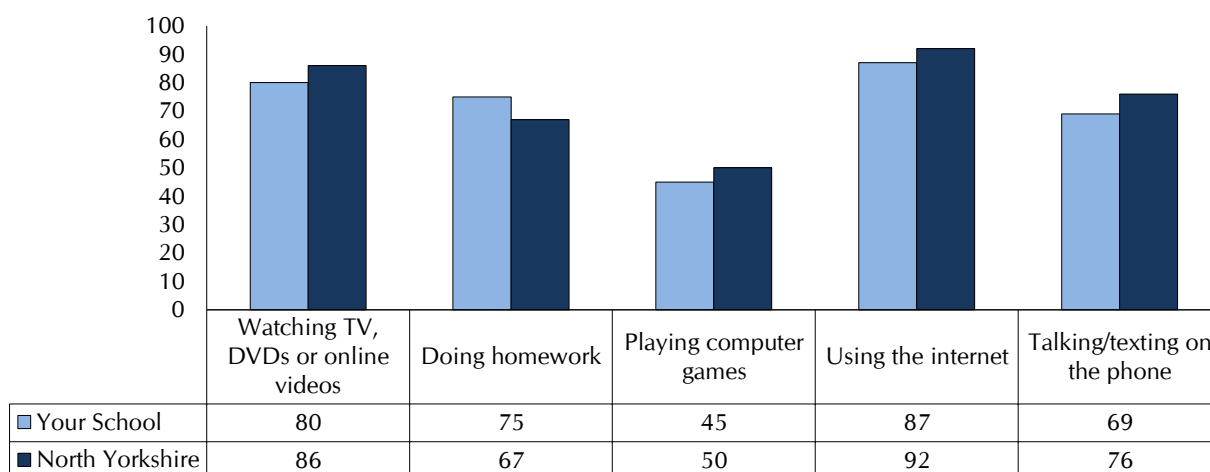

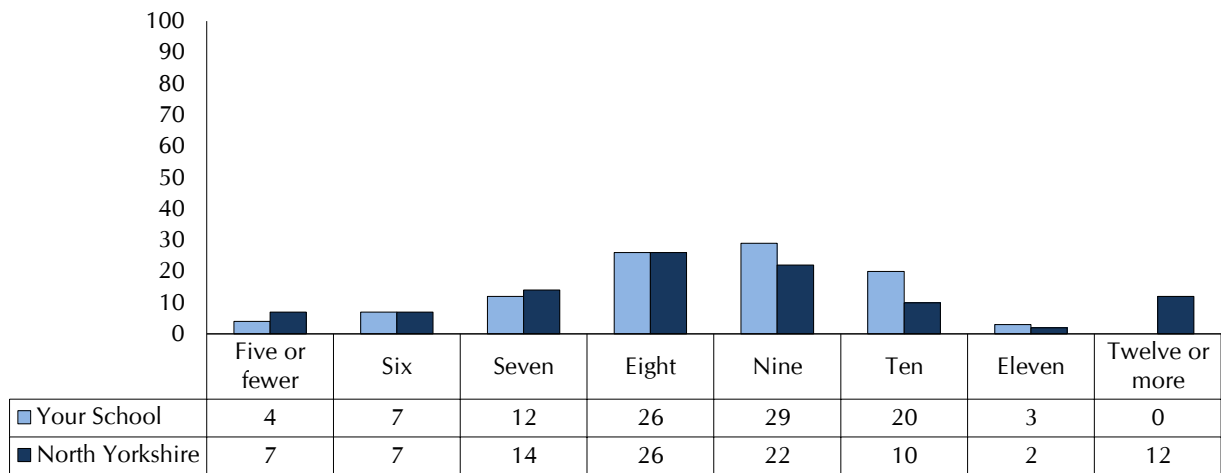

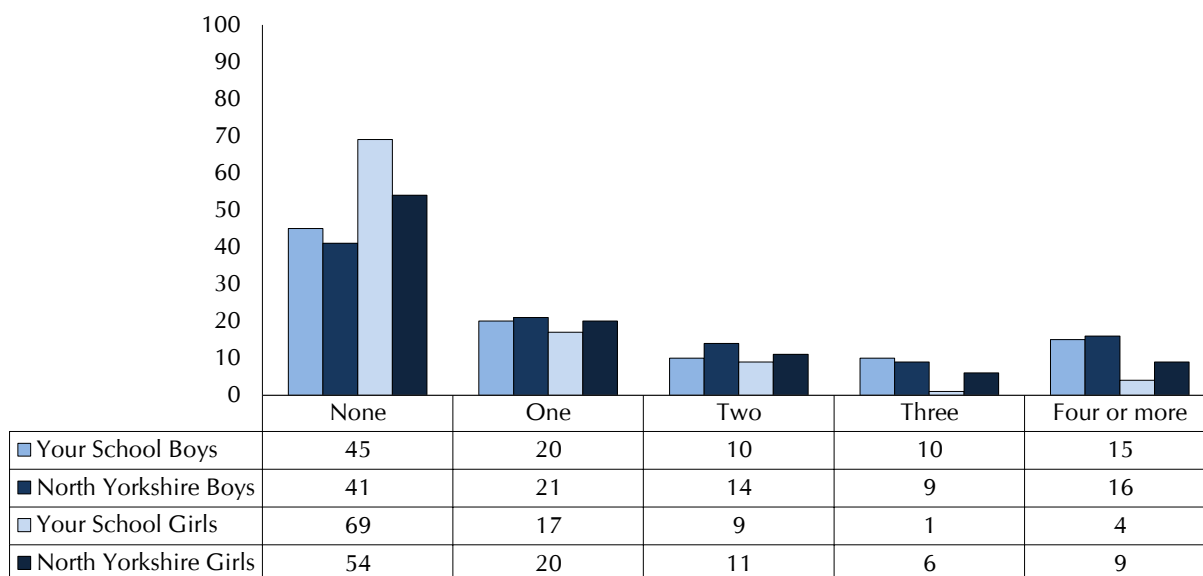

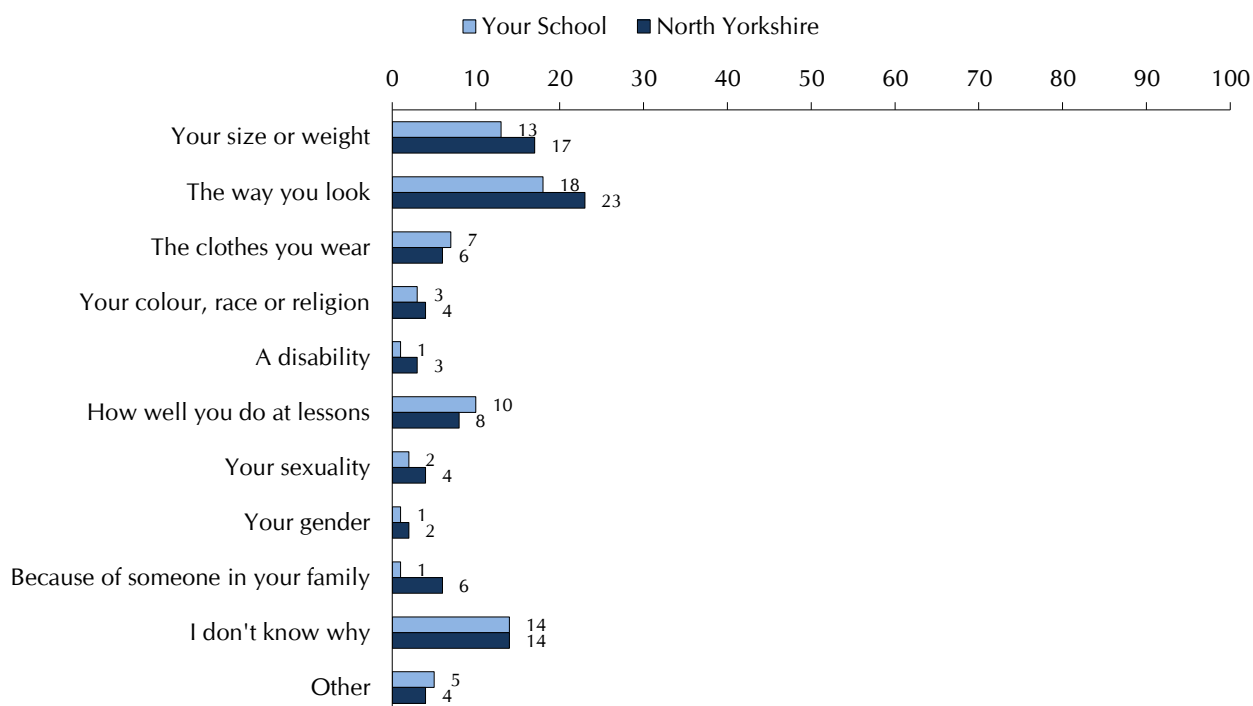

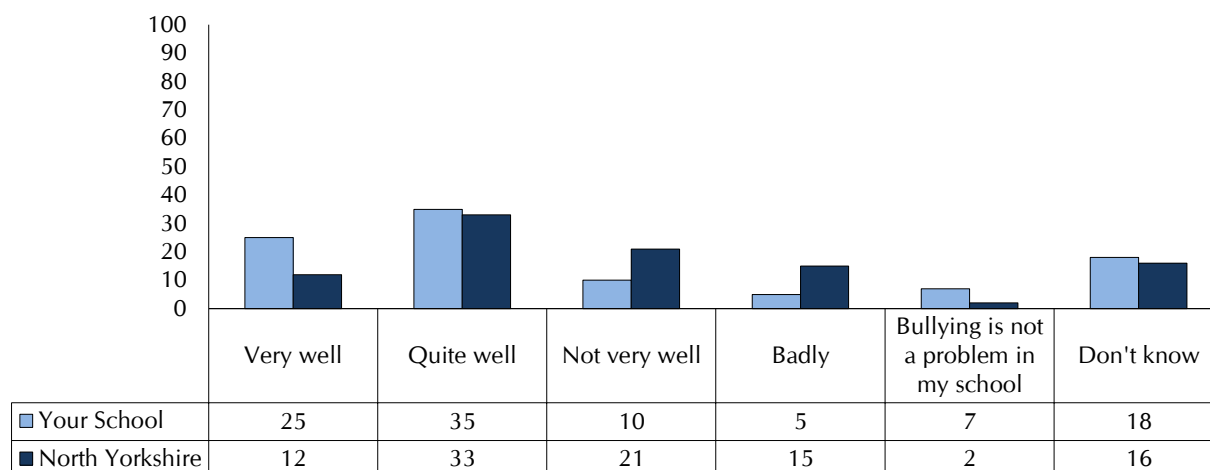

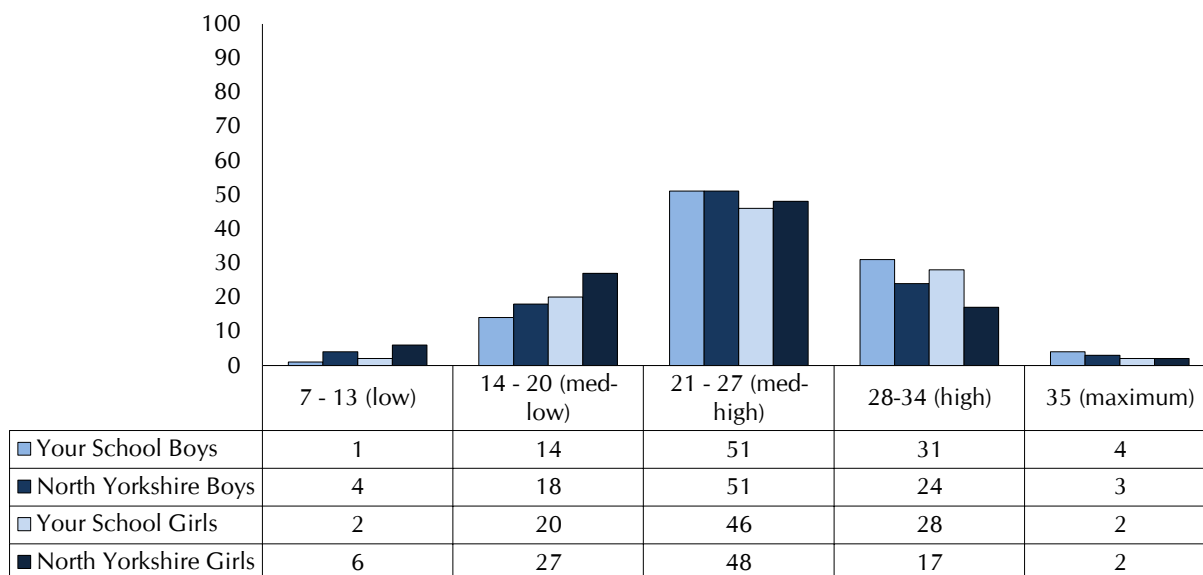

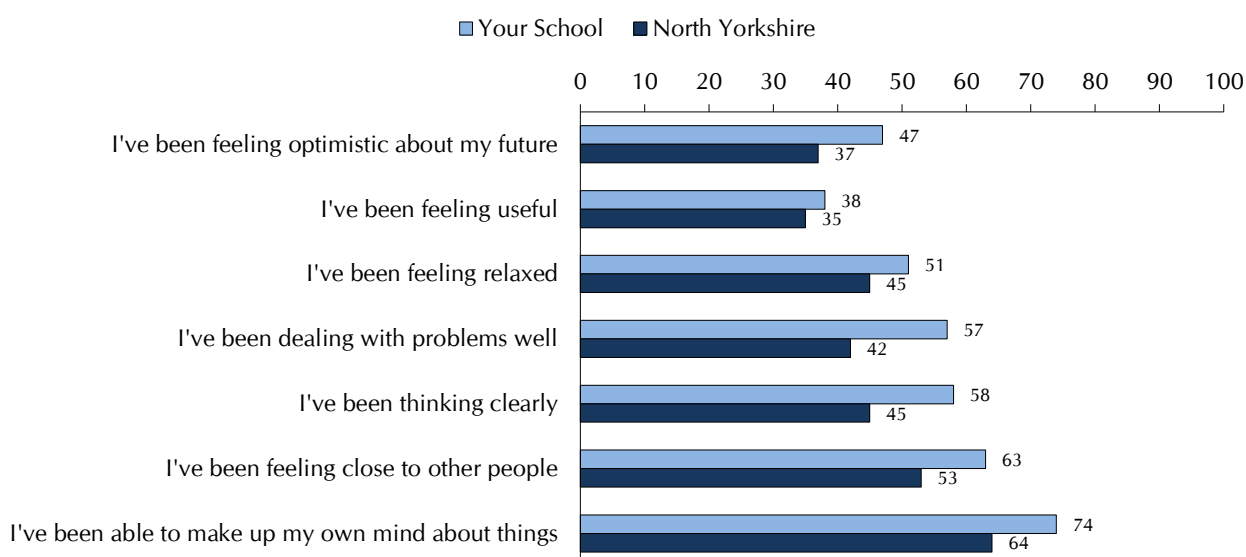

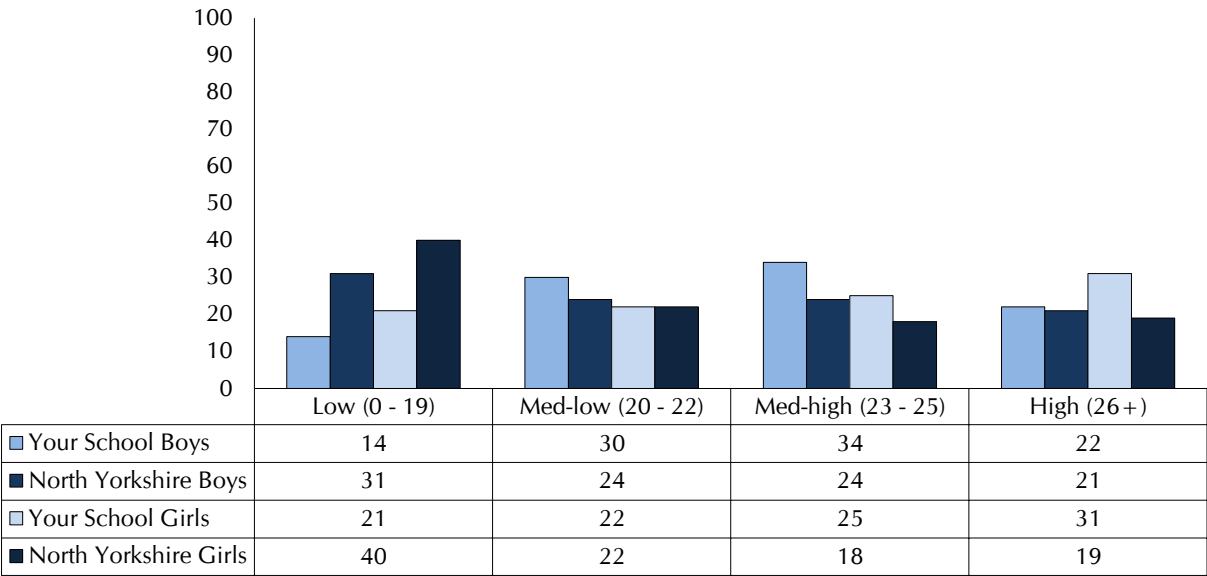

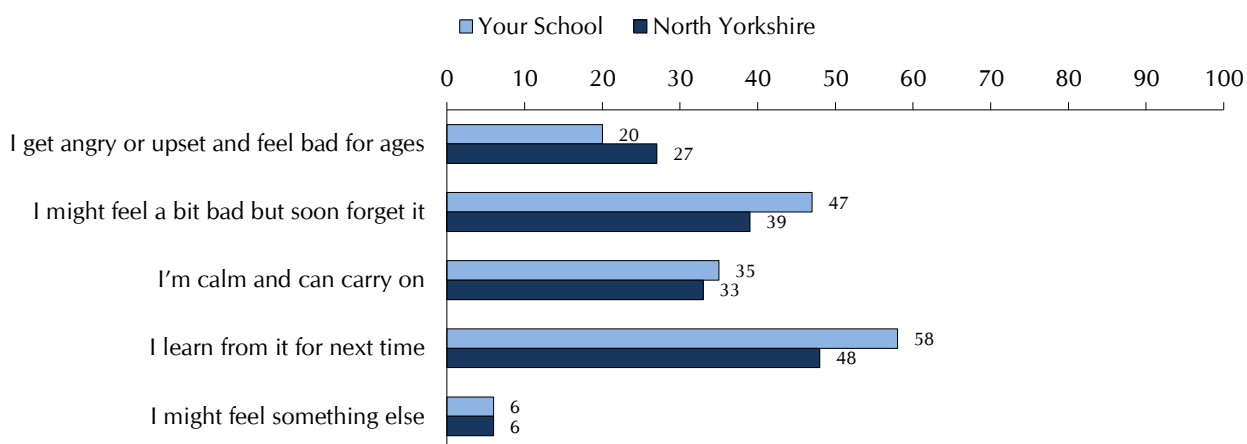

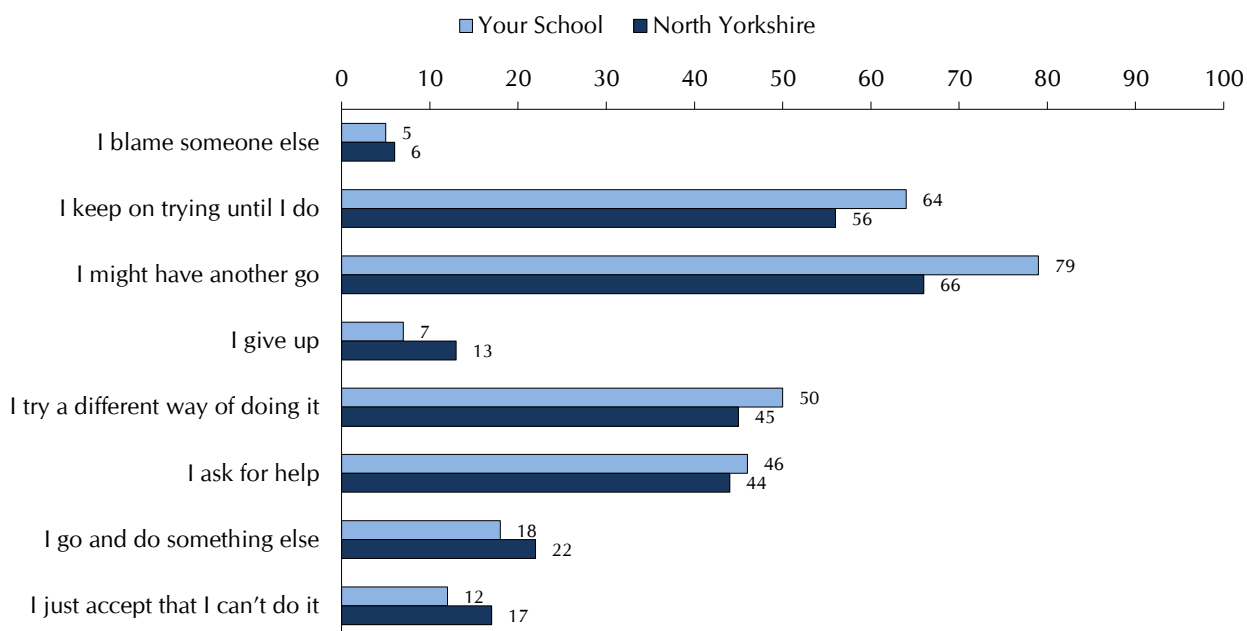

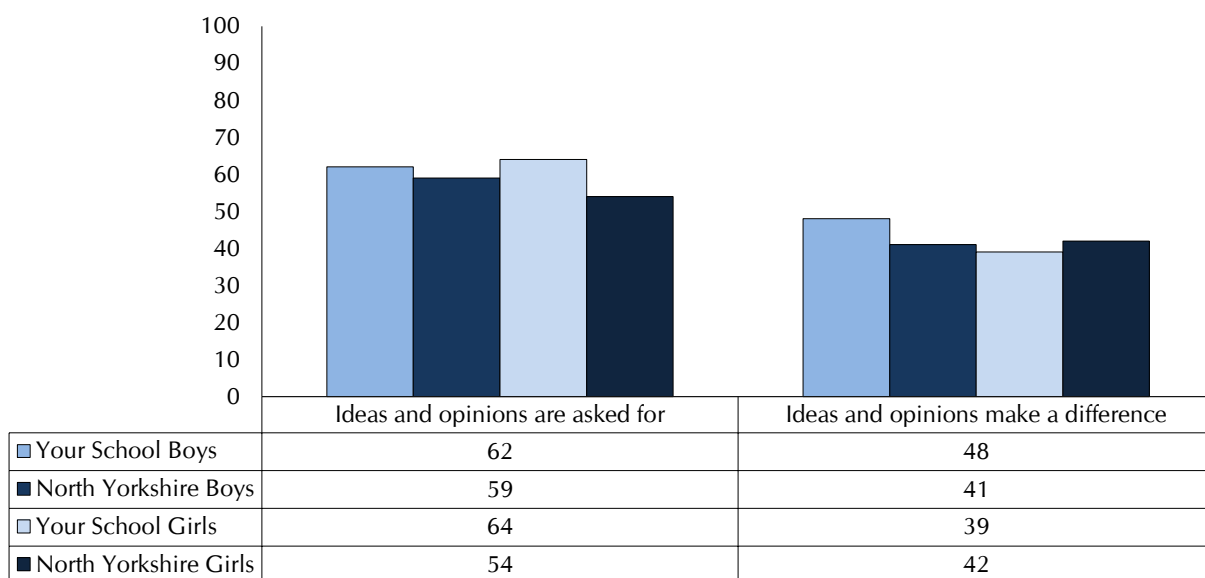
Q52. Percentage of pupils responding that they 'usually' or 'always' do the following if at first they don't succeed:

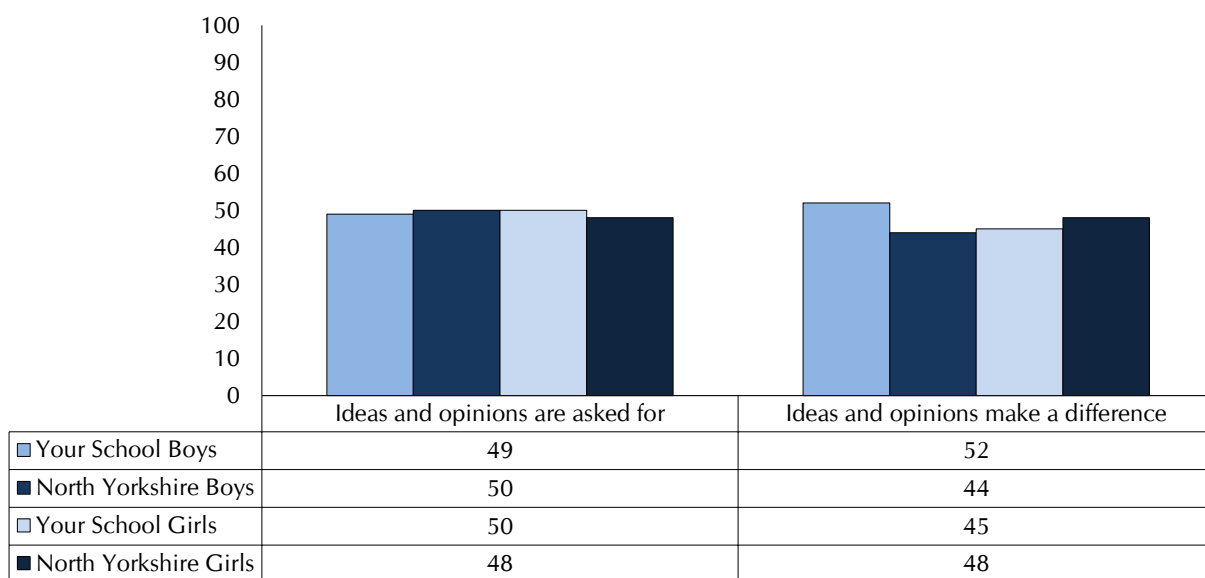

Q53. Percentage of pupils responding to questions about what they learn in school:



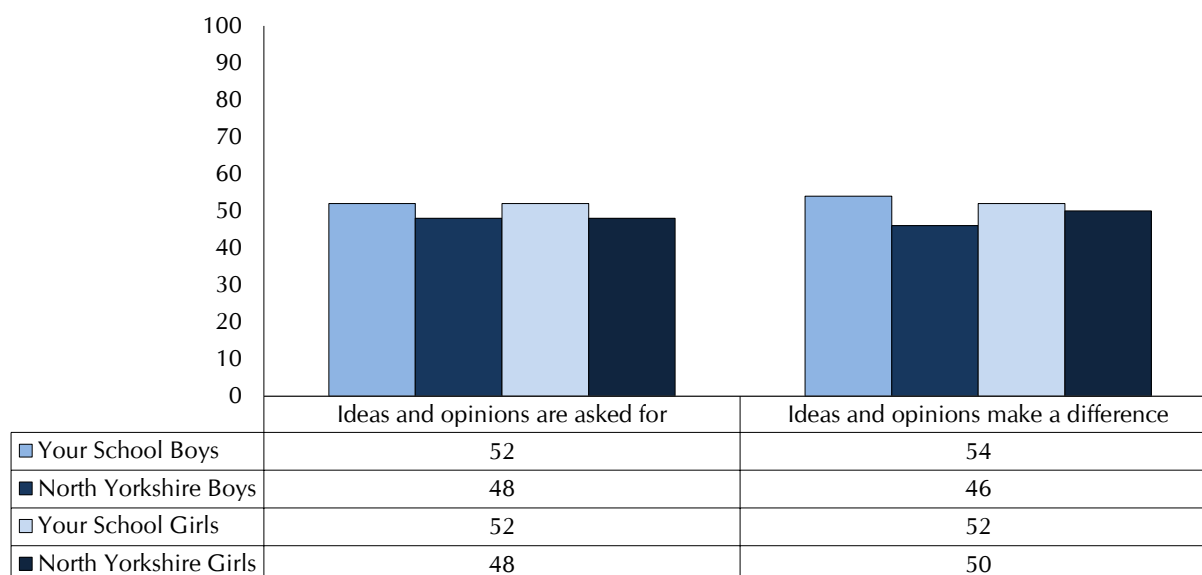

Q53. Percentage of pupils responding to questions about how they learn in school:



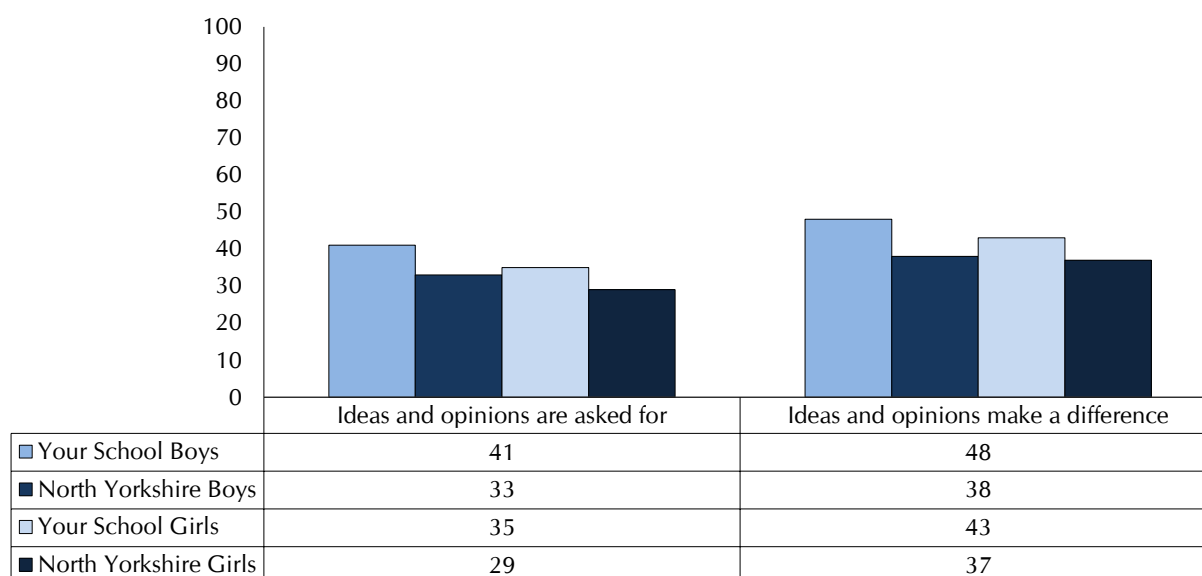

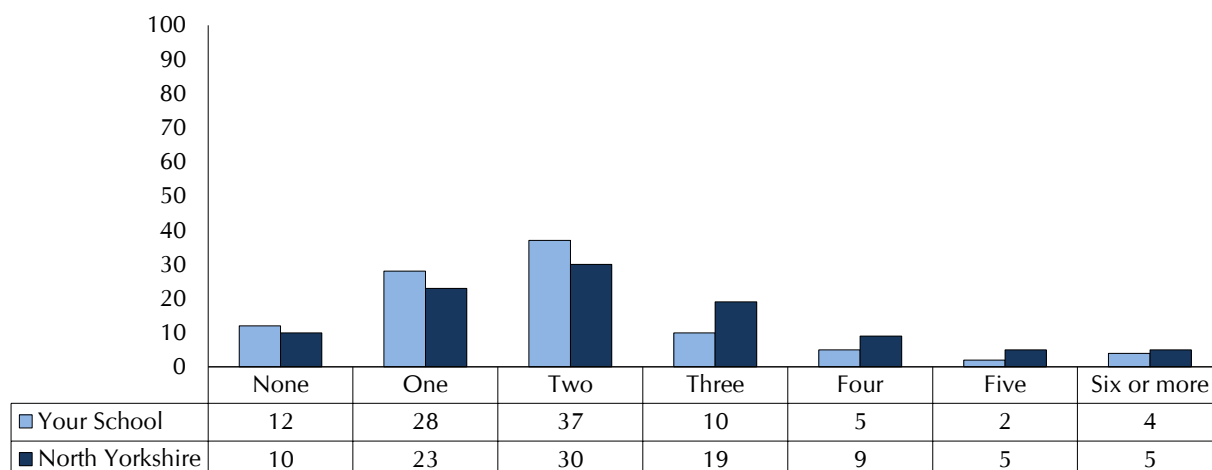

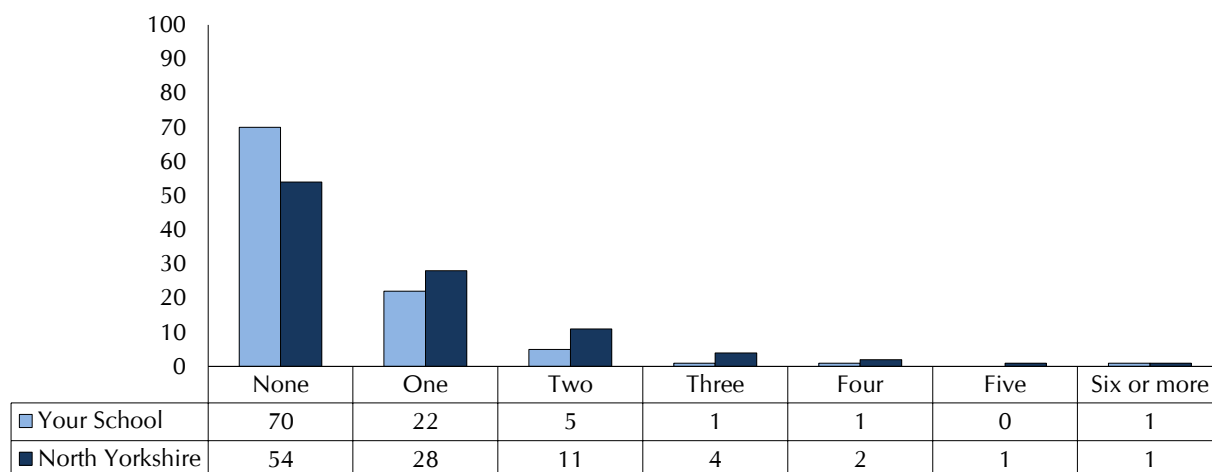

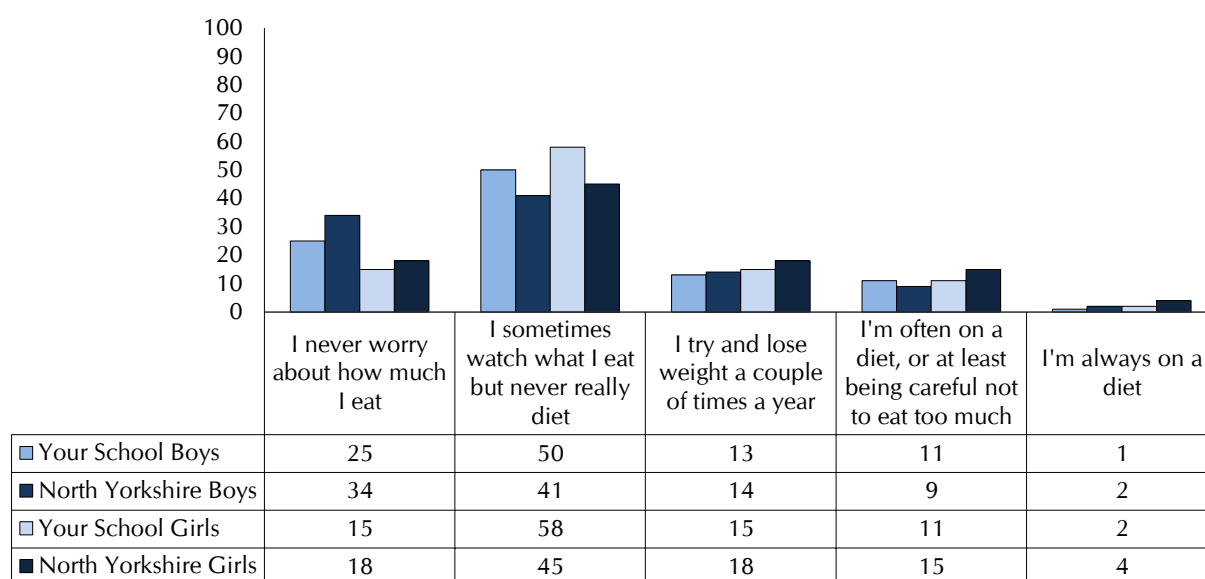

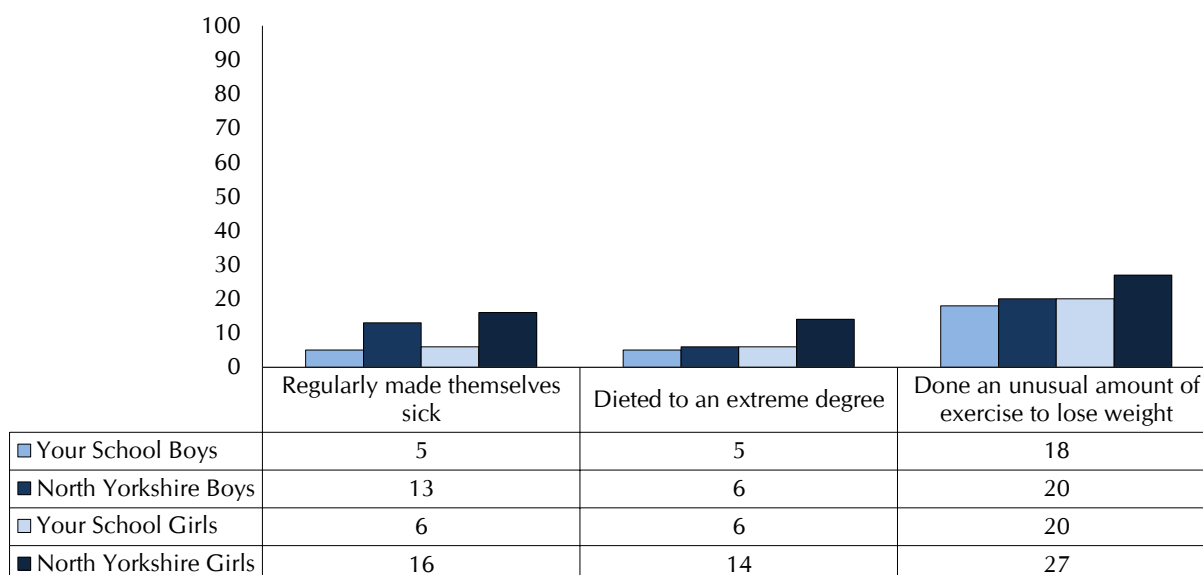

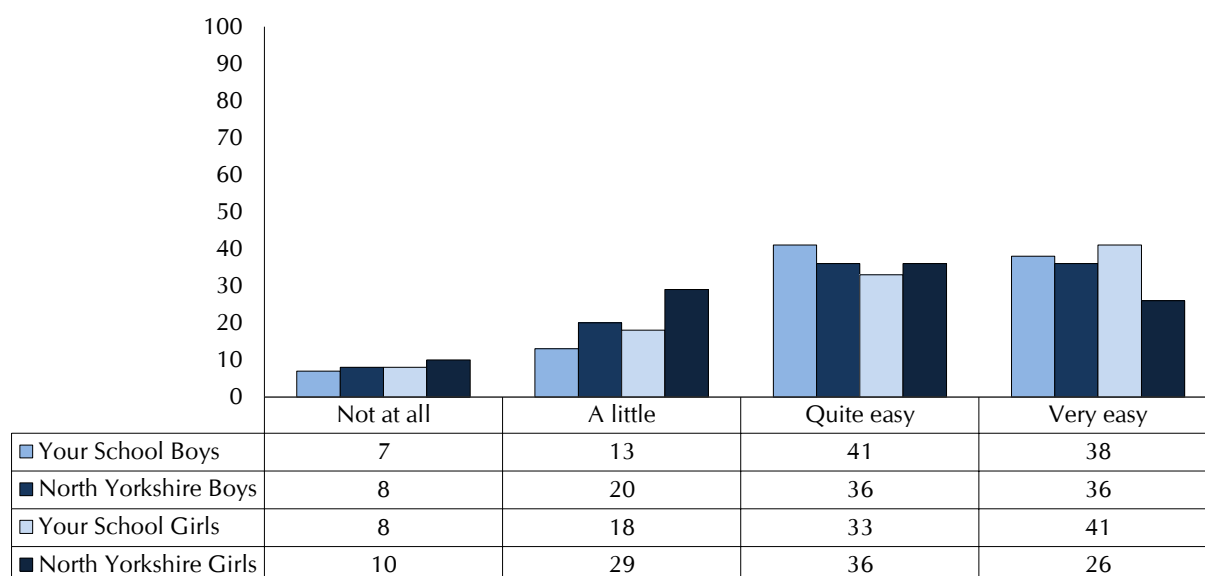

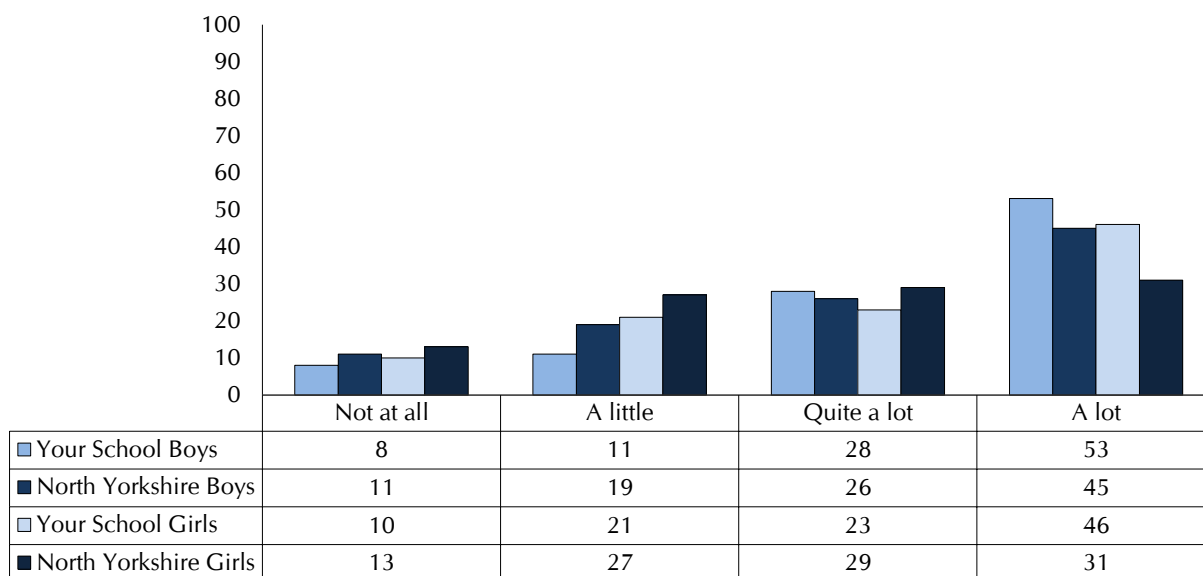

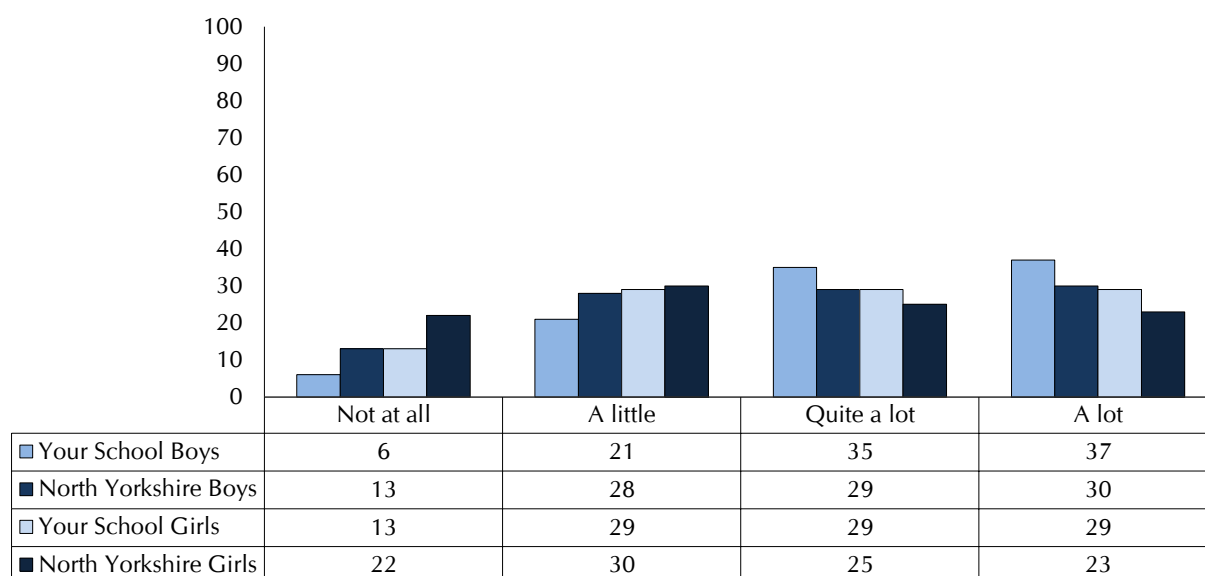

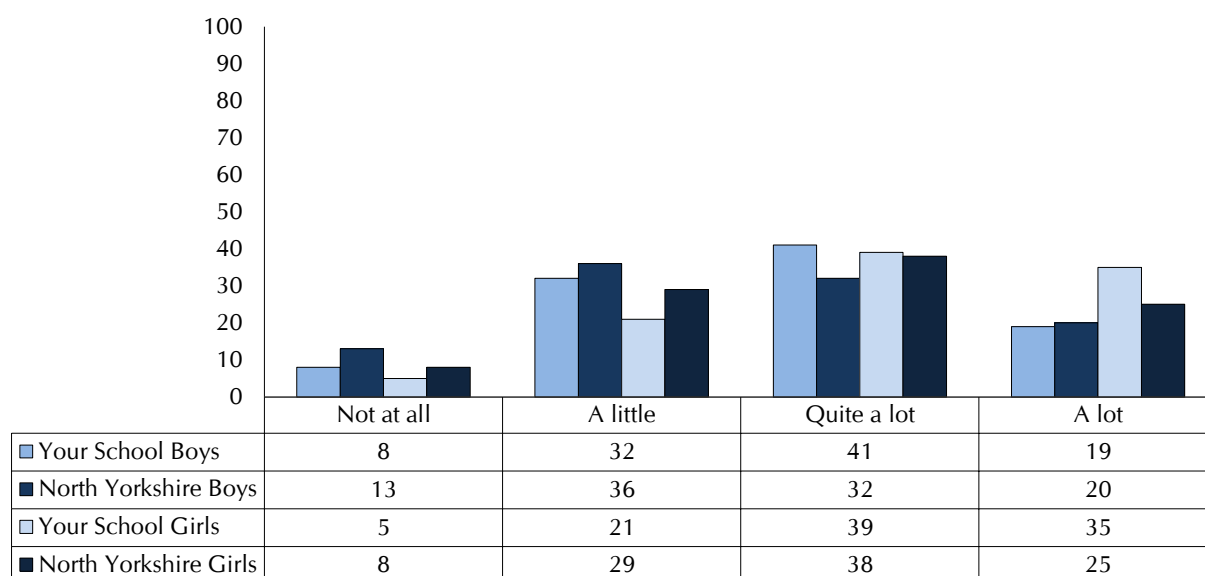

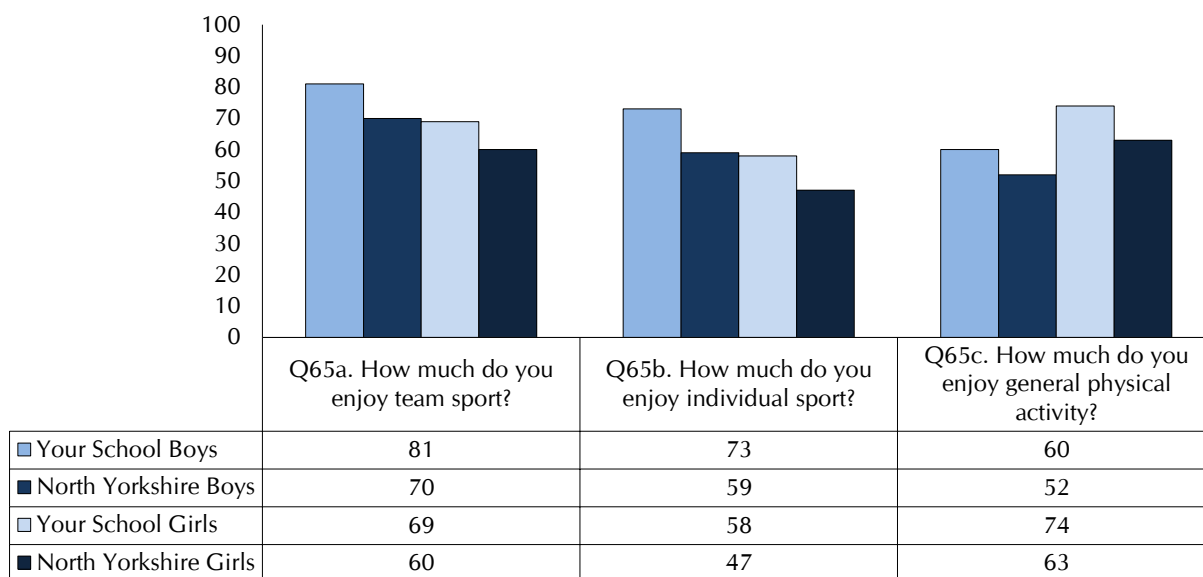

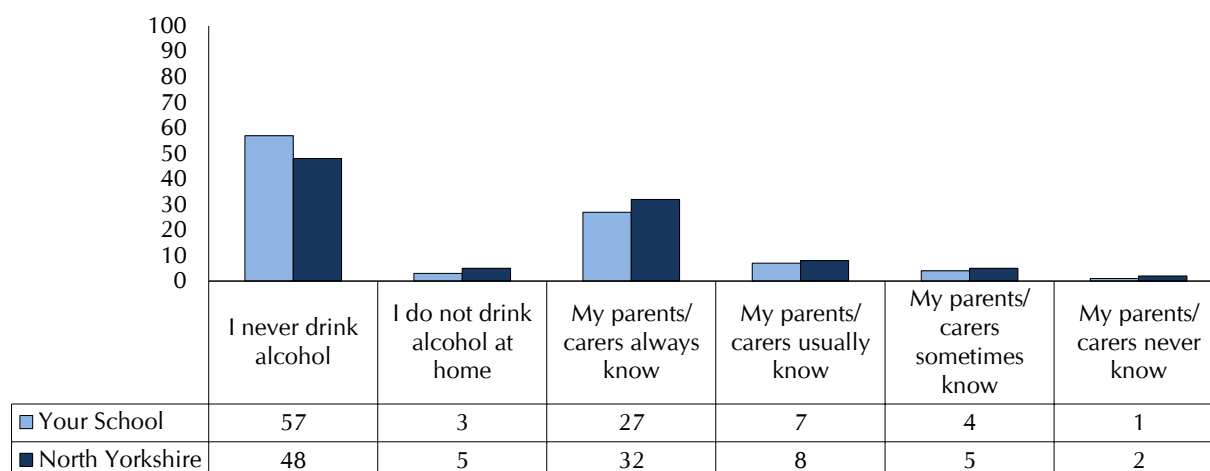
Q65. Physical activity summary: Percentage of pupils responding 'quite a lot' or 'a lot' to the following:

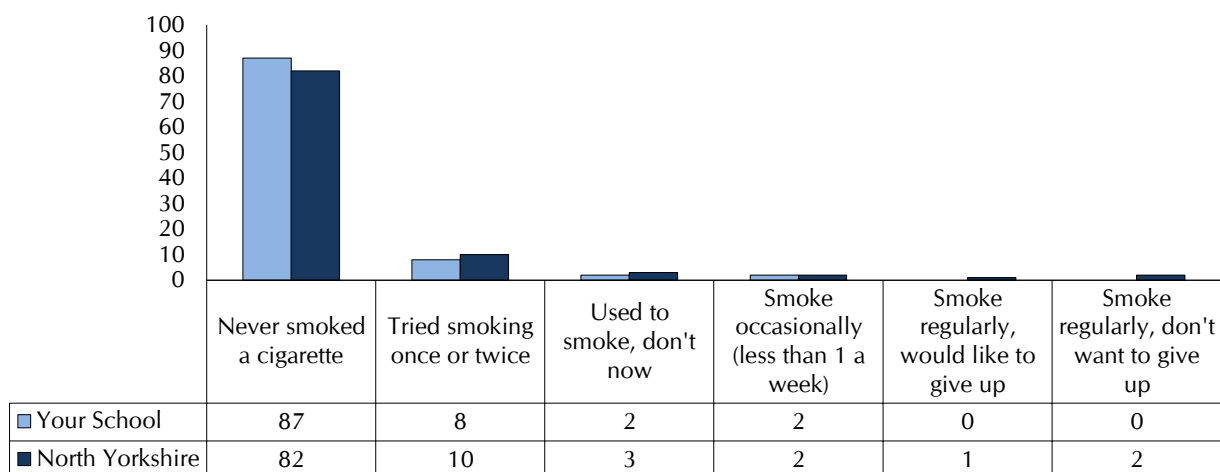

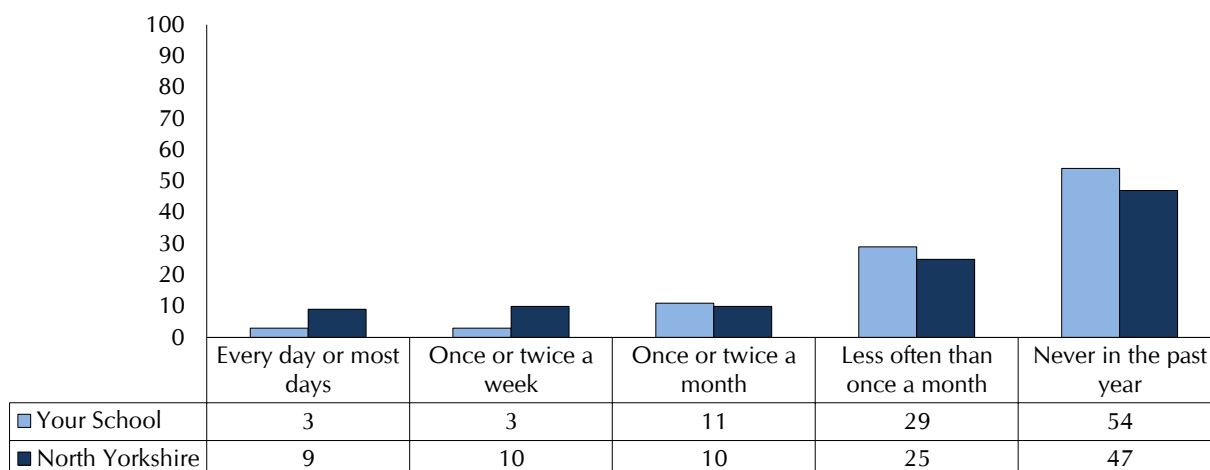

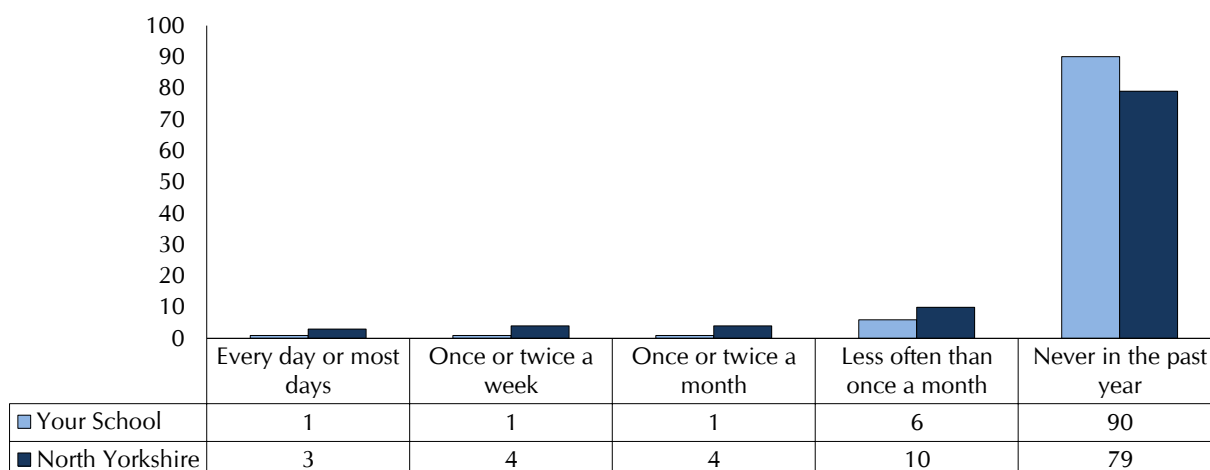

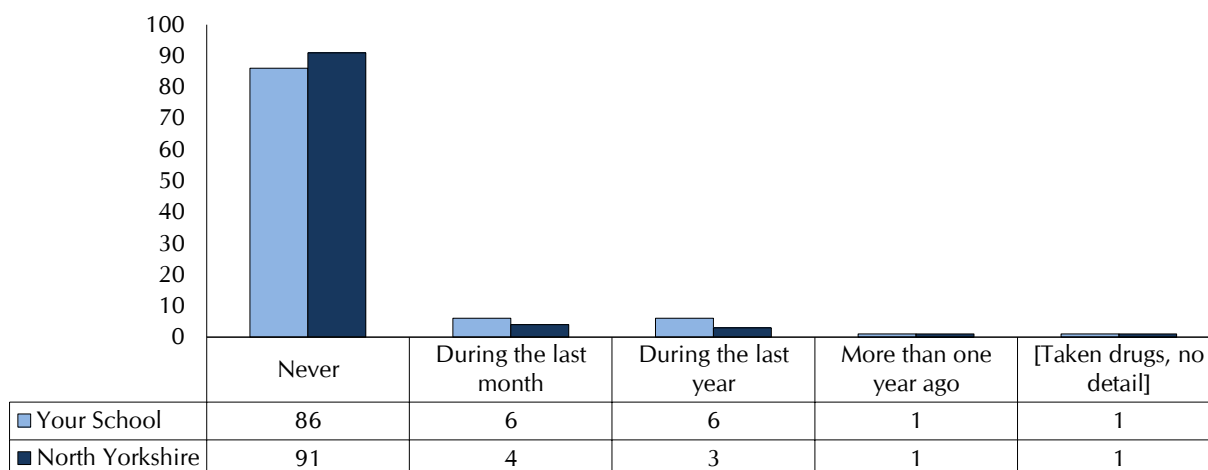

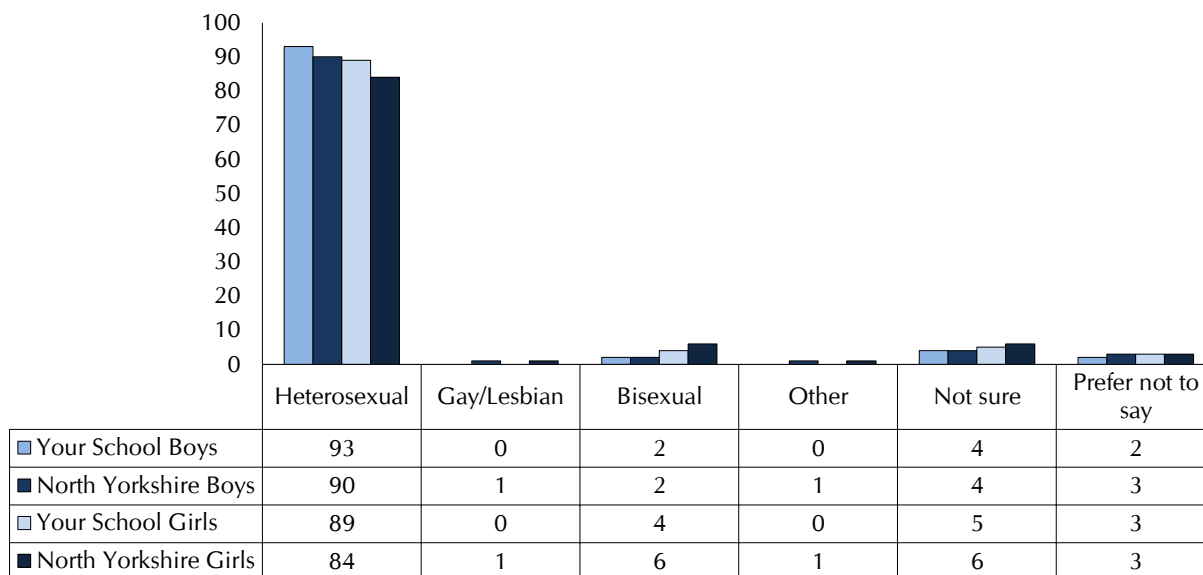

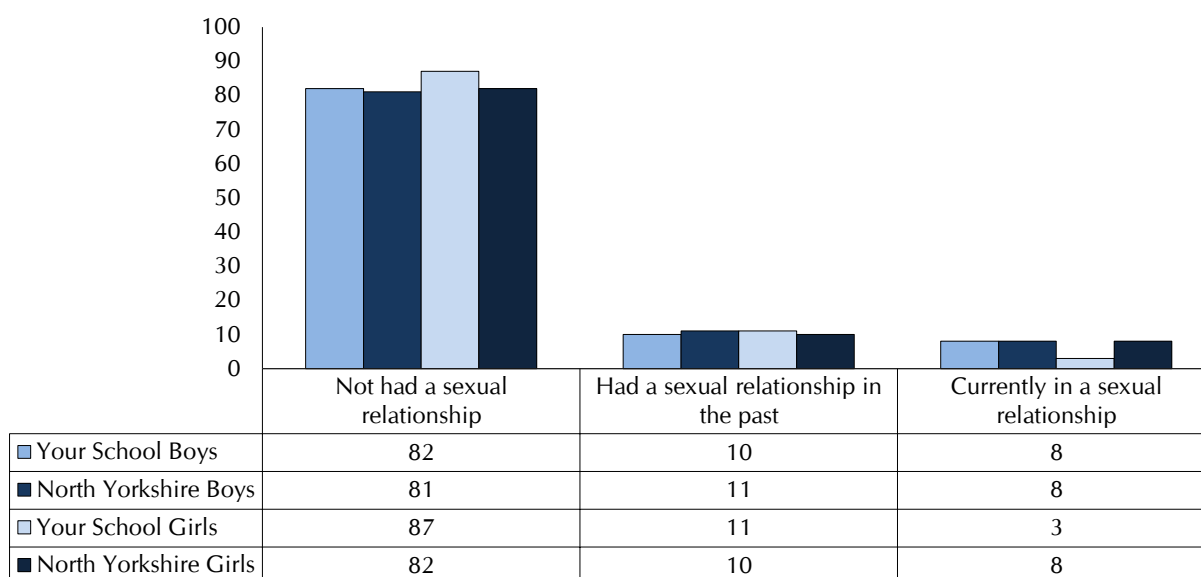

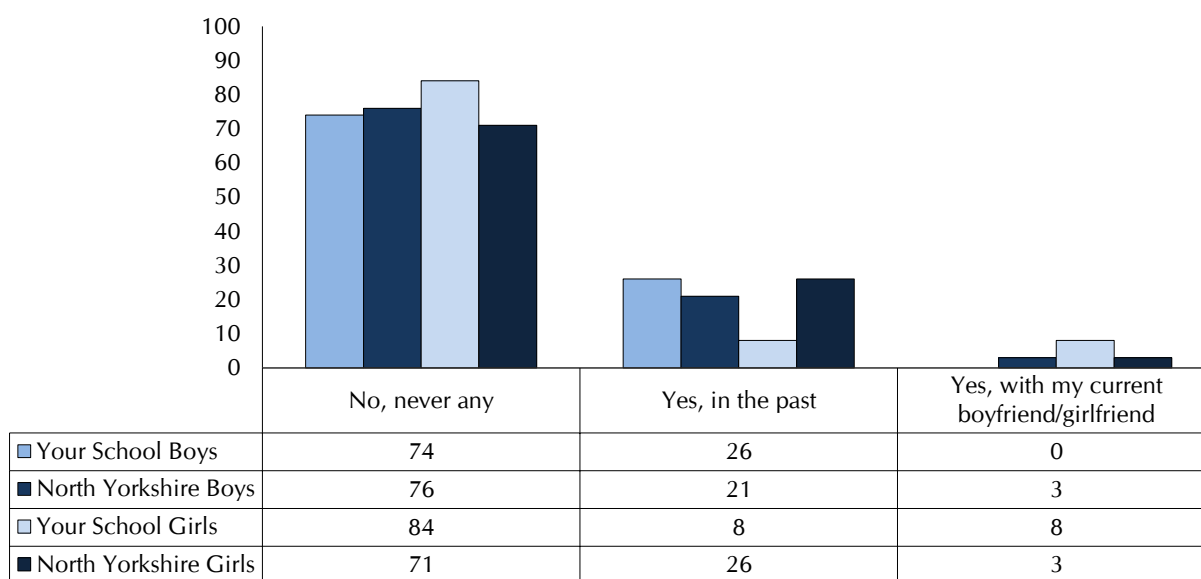

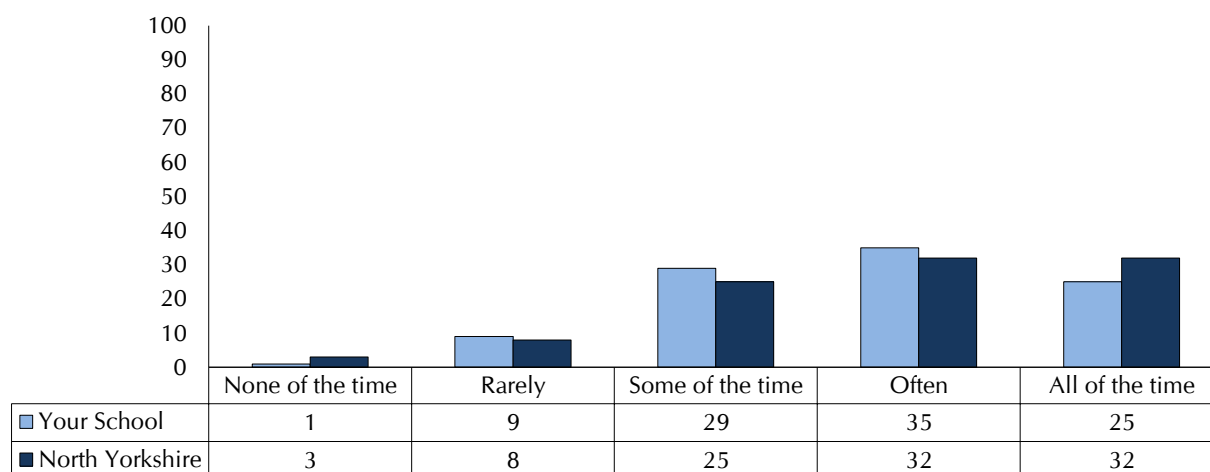

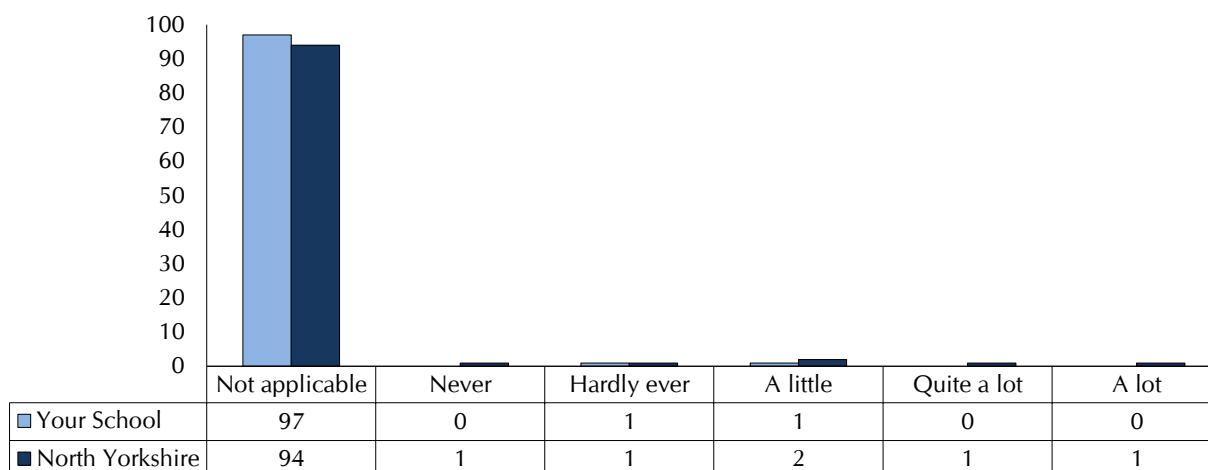
