

Year 10 - Post 16 Options

During Year 10 you will need to make some decisions about what you would like to do after Year 11 and GCSEs. There are many different options available and the Careers Department are available to work with you in providing impartial information, advice and guidance. You will have an individual 30-minute career guidance interview during Year 11, which will be scheduled for you sometime between the October and February half terms but before this time our fact sheet will help you to make realistic and informed decisions about your future plans.

You are legally obliged to remain in education or training until you are 18. This means that you must be enrolled with one of the following:

- A Sixth Form School
- A College of Further Education
- Employment with Training such as an Apprenticeship or Traineeship

The Associated Sixth Form

Studying A Levels and Level 3 Applied Courses in the Associated Sixth From enables you to continue your GCSE subjects in greater depth and/or discover new subjects that are only offered after Year 11. You will choose to study 3 subjects and it is important to consider subjects that:

- You enjoy
- You believe you can do well in
- You may need to enable you to access opportunities in the future

OVERALL REQUIREMENTS FOR SIXTH FORM ENTRY				
A Level courses	A minimum of five GCSE subjects at grade 5 including Mathematics and English Language depending on individual course requirements.			
Combination of A Level courses and Applied courses	From two GCSE subjects at grade 5 plus three subjects at grade 4, to five subjects at grade 4 including Mathematics and English Language depending on individual course requirements.			
Applied courses	Four GCSE subjects at grade 4 including Mathematics and English Language.			

Further Education Colleges

Some colleges offer a range of A Level subjects such as York College and Leeds City College, however all offer vocational and practical courses. These are related to a broad employment area such as business, engineering, IT and health and social care and provide the opportunity to gain relevant qualifications and train for a specific career. Most courses are either 1 or 2 years in length.

If you are considering making an application to college it is important to research courses and entry requirements on individual college websites and sign up to attend open/taster days. Local colleges include:

Apprenticeships

Apprenticeships provide the opportunity to:

- Gain an insight into the realities of working in a particular job/sector of industry
- Develop the skills required to work in that employment
- Study for nationally recognised qualifications such as NVQs
- Get paid at least the National Apprenticeship wage of £4.15 per hour

Apprenticeships are available across many different sectors of industry. Training can take between 1 and 2 years before you are fully qualified and as a rule you will spend 80% of your working week with your employer and 20% with your training provider.

Traineeships

If you do not feel ready for an apprenticeship you could consider a traineeship. This will enable you to further develop your skills and experience on a course which includes a work placement before you apply for your first apprenticeship or job. Traineeships can last from 6 weeks to 6 months.

Year 11 Work Experience

Work Experience represents an invaluable opportunity to identify individual work-related skills and raise confidence and aspirations and an optional Year 11 Work Experience Programme forms part of the extended curriculum offered to all pupils. Students are encouraged to arrange one week of work within a local (North Yorkshire, Leeds, Bradford or York) business or organisation following their exams next May/June which fits around end of year activities such as the Ardèche trips and the Year 11 prom.

Students will be guided through the process by Mrs Farrar who coordinates the Work Experience Programme, from registration for the scheme through to an evaluation of the scheme following a successful and informative placement. Further information will be available early in the Autumn term of Year 11.
