ENTRY TO ST AIDAN'S & ST JOHN FISHER ASSOCIATED SIXTH FORM

I write to explain the planned arrangements for entry to the Sixth Form in September. There is clearly ongoing uncertainty regarding social distancing regulations and we will inform you as soon as possible if any of the details below have to be amended.

FRIDAY 19 JUNE: The planned Induction day cannot now go ahead. Instead we have compiled an introductory video which can be viewed on YouTube (search St Aidan's and St John Fisher Associated Sixth Form Induction Video). If you have any questions after watching the film please email associatedsixthform@staidans.co.uk; we will then compile a list of FAQs and post these on the website.

THURSDAY 20 AUGUST: GCSE results are received. The formal discussion of courses will take place on 3 September. If you wish to notify me of a change of course prior to this discussion please email <u>associatedsixthform@staidans.co.uk</u>.

THURSDAY 3 SEPTEMBER: All students should attend for interview and confirmation of courses in Constance Green Hall at St Aidan's. Parents are welcome to attend. Could students attend in the following timeframes:

Surnames beginning A – B	9.00 am to 10.00 am

Surnames beginning G – H	11.00 am to 12.30 pm

WEDNESDAY 9 SEPTEMBER: All Year 12 students starting the Sixth Form will attend school for a full day's programme from 8.45 am to 3.35 pm. Students should dress smartly.

The Sixth Form timetable will then run as normal from Thursday 10 September. You may like to note that the Sixth Form's expectations and monitoring system will be explained to parents at a Pastoral Parents' Evening later in September.



I would like to stress some general points for the year ahead. We do need constant attendance to ensure the maximum success in Sixth Form exams including, Year 12 exams to be taken next summer. Furthermore, prospective employers and tutors are now seeking precise attendance data as part of reference requests. We implement a clear Attendance Policy and attendance at registration, timetabled sessions and supervised study will be monitored closely. For safeguarding purposes also, students must remain on site throughout the school day. Details of the Attendance Policy will be issued at enrolment and we would ask for your full support in this matter.

National guidelines advise that 40 hours of learning time per week are required for students to achieve their full potential. Please help students to settle into a routine that allows them to double the work that

they do in school. Off-peak holidays pose a threat to the prospects of our students and I would ask you to avoid them during the next two years. Part-time jobs can also interfere with academic work. Whilst there can be no objection to employment at weekends, midweek employment is disruptive to any habit of work and should be avoided.

More and more students wish to use cars or motor bikes to come to school. We accept this, if it is necessary, but insist that they are parked off-site and NOT used to travel between school sites. We ask that students register their vehicles with the Sixth Form Office and that they are mindful of local residents' interests when using and parking on nearby streets.

Students are required to dress to convey a smart impression; this means collar and tie and trousers for boys and dress or smart top with trousers or skirts for girls. Both denim and trainers are not acceptable. We reserve the right to send home students who are unsatisfactorily dressed.

We believe that Student Planners are essential for organisation in the Sixth Form: whilst the Association subsidises the cost of these, we ask that at enrolment all students pay £10 towards the two year cost of Student Planners. Our preferred method of payment is by ParentPay but we will also accept a cheque (cheques should be made payable to St Aidan's and St John Fisher Associated Sixth Form). Students will then receive a planner in September containing information about the Sixth Form which they and you will be asked to read. I will then require parent and student to sign an undertaking to be bound by the stated conditions of the Learning Agreement.

We also require a digital passport-style photograph and would be grateful if you could send this electronically to: <u>sixthformidphotos@staidans.co.uk</u> entering the student's name in the subject line of the email. These are required to produce the students' identification badges: to ensure that these are ready for the start of the September term, please send in your photograph by 19 June 2020. I would be most grateful for your support in ensuring that this is achieved so that we can concentrate immediately upon academic work in September.

I do hope that these procedures and this information will help to lay firm foundations for success in the Sixth Form.
