Conduct and Gatherings

Thank you to the vast number of students who are supporting the schools in these current challenging times. We expect all students to respect the one-way system and Covid secure systems in place at both schools and to act as role models for younger students.

Outside of school, when moving between sites and especially at lunchtime, it is vital that students remain in groups of 6 or less as people will be fined £200 for a first offence. In addition, students must be polite and respectful when coming into contact with members of the public, moving to one side on paths. It has been really disappointing this week to receive complaints from the public about students who have been rude and disrespectful. Every single Sixth Form student needs to play their part and take responsibility for their own actions, remembering at all times that they are representing the Associated Sixth Form.

Movement between Lessons

In order to limit contact between year groups, Year 12 students are asked to walk to and from St John Fisher **on the opposite side of Oatlands Drive** from the St Aidan's site, crossing St Hilda's Road and using the pedestrian crossing outside St John Fisher before entering or leaving the St John Fisher site.

Year 13 students should walk to and from St John Fisher site on the St Aidan's side of Oatlands Drive, crossing Wheatlands Road East and Park Edge before crossing Hookstone Road via the pedestrian crossing at the corner of Oatlands Drive.

Driving to school

Please note:

- If you drive to school please register your car with the Sixth Form Office via the sheet in the form registers.
- You should not park within the school grounds either in the Main School car park or Bede car park.
- If you park on the adjacent streets, please park considerately and respect the local community.
- You should not return to your car during the day or use your car for travelling between the two sites and should only return to your car at the end of the school day.
