Face Coverings

Last week, St. Aidan's and St. John Fisher were given the very clear guidance by the Public Health Team at North Yorkshire County Council that we should 'strongly recommend' that face coverings are worn by all staff and students who are able to wear one (that is, not face mask exempt) in communal areas. The guidance does not apply to classrooms where lessons are taught but does apply to all other areas in school. This has come about because of increased levels of infection in our region.

It is entirely in keeping with the ethos of the school that, for the benefit of others, we are content to put up with the inconvenience of wearing a face covering while the circumstances prevail and the guidance applies to us. The risks associated with contracting coronavirus can be very serious and you will also be aware that, in our community at St Aidan's and the Associated Sixth Form, we need to be especially careful in respect of those who are clinically extremely vulnerable.

We expect that all in the Associated Sixth Form will show the lead in following all the measures that are in place at this time, including the strong recommendation to wear a face covering, and to do so without the need for prompting. In all areas outside classrooms we expect Sixth Form students to wear a face covering: in corridors, toilets, the library, study centre and, except when seated and eating or drinking, in the café or marquee. There is no requirement to wear a face covering in outdoor spaces.

The advice that we have been given by the public health authorities is based on evidence that face coverings may be significant in helping to prevent the transmission of coronavirus and we should therefore use face coverings in our efforts to protect those in our community. We want to keep all students in school if at all possible (for example, without disruptive periods of self-isolation) and to do all we can to limit the spread of the virus.

Please, wear a face covering that you have brought from home and do so without the need for prompting. Thank you.

Year 13 - The 7 Step Guide to completing UCAS applications

- Step 1
 - Write your personal statement and show it to your Senior Tutor.
 - Book a careers appointment should you require advice and help from a Careers Adviser.

- Step 2
 - o Complete your UCAS form and add in your personal statement.

- Step 3
 - Complete the Cover Sheet (copy emailed to students on 8 October). This information will help your Senior Tutor write your reference.
 - Bring this with a copy of your completed UCAS form to the Careers Department to be checked and submitted. Or email the Careers Department to let them know you have completed your UCAS form and we can check it online.

Step 4

When your UCAS form has been checked by the Careers Department press Pay and Send on UCAS.

Step 5

- The Sixth Form Office will arrange for your reference to be written and then send your form to UCAS.
- o This can take up to 2 to 3 weeks and UCAS will email you to acknowledge receipt of your email.

Step 6

- UCAS will send your application to your universities who will correspond with you via UCAS Track
- You need to check this on a regular basis regarding interviews, auditions and offers.
- o If you have not initially applied for 5 courses, you can add on extra ones via UCAS Track up until the 15 January.

Step 7

- Wait until you have received all your offers before accepting one as your firm and another as your insurance.
- o You have until May 2021 to do this.

At any step if you need any help please contact your Senior Tutor and/or the Careers Department - we are all here to help you.

The **deadline** for handing in your UCAS form is **Thursday 15 October.** If this is going to be a problem, then please discuss with your Senior Tutor as a matter of urgency.
