#### Pizza pizza!









## Careers - Year 13 next steps

The Careers Department have been busy this term helping our Year 13 students complete their applications for Higher and Further Education courses. We have also been organising virtual interview practice and guidance and have been fortunate in this to work with consultants from Harrogate District Hospital, Primary Education degree providers and our own Work Experience Co-ordinator, Mrs Farrar. We are excited to now see course offers come rolling in for the students and will be supporting them in making their firm choices in the coming months.

Our attention next term will turn to working with those Year 13 students wanting to make applications for employment or plan a gap year and we look forward to providing bespoke information, advice and guidance and virtual work experience opportunities to assist them in this process.



#### **Budding chemists**

As part of the extra-curricular opportunities available in Science, a number of Sixth Form students are taking part in the RSC UK Chemistry Olympiad.

Budding chemists will develop critical problem-solving skills, learn to think more creatively and get a chance to test their knowledge in new, real-world situations. They will be taking a two-hour exam in January, with the possibility of finding themselves representing the UK at the prestigious International Chemistry Olympiad to be held in Japan.

In addition to this, over twenty Year 12 students are embarking upon an Earth Observation project delivered through the Institute for Research in Schools (IRIS). This is with a view to attending an IRIS conference to present their findings - from utilising satellite data, to understanding our changing world.





#### Religious Studies tryptychs
