Virtual Work Experience

We would encourage you to take advantage of some of the amazing virtual work-related opportunities available during May half-term and beyond. Companies are keen to open the eyes of young people to the fast moving and fascinating world of work that awaits them and have invested considerable resources in putting together well thought out and bespoke programmes.

Many opportunities are one day only providing students with a snapshot of careers and professions they might never have considered and can be hosted by national or global companies, normally inaccessible to young people. Most companies issue certificates of completion which students can add to their CV's and all will give students invaluable experience and help develop work related skills.

Feedback from students who have already taken part has been excellent, most reporting a very high-quality experience with life-changing, light bulb moments!
