This is a great reflection on our teachers in school who taught Kate, particularly in History.




Year 9 Textiles Competition



National and global companies, many of them home to well-known brands and normally inaccessible to school students, have expertly harnessed this new way of working to produce some extremely effective, interactive work experience opportunities.

Digital Forensics, Architecture, Photography, Quantity Surveying, Personal Training, Neuropsychology, Global Publishing, Farming Technology and Artificial Intelligence are amongst the huge variety of placements available across diverse and less traditional career sectors.

Some take place over several days, whilst others are one day insights, but feedback to date has been universally positive. Students who have taken part already report that the experience has significantly increased their confidence and enabled them to develop and evidence valuable work related skills such as problem solving, teamwork, organisation and presentation skills.






Reading Corner

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Virtual IRIS Conference

During this academic year, fourteen Year 12 students have completed an IRIS research project called Earth observation.

This has involved the students training themselves in using online software to analyse data, before then using the software to conduct their own research project independently. Students have conducted projects on a wide variety of topics including polar bear migration, volcanic eruptions and the effects of palm oil plantations.

On Wednesday 12th May, students presented their findings in the form of posters at the virtual IRIS conference. During the conference students were asked questions about their research, had the chance to read and hear about the research that has been carried out in other schools and listened to two key note speakers. These key note speakers spoke to the students about their journeys in academia and the research that they carry out.

Well done to all the students who took part in the project.



Senate Launch

After the Half term break, it will be time once again to begin elections for a new Senate in the Sixth Form.

The Senate is the Sixth Form Student Council, a group of Year 13 students who represent the student body as a whole. The students elected to be part of the Senate represent the Sixth Form at various meetings and events, lead lower school assemblies, as well as organise charity days, socials and arrangements for Year 13 Leavers'.

On Monday 7th June, the Senate process will be launched. The following week, information will be sent out regarding each candidate's application for their potential place on the Senate, with voting commencing during lunchtime on Thursday 17th June in Constance Green Hall.

Year 12 students and staff will choose their ten preferred candidates. The ten candidates with the most votes are then elected - with the two highest scoring 'newcomers' automatically gaining places on the Senate - to ensure fair representation of those students who were new to St Aidan's School at the beginning of Year 12.

Sixth Form Law Event

A handful of dedicated Year 13 students have been participating in a wonderfully organised and expertly delivered law programme by BPP Law School.

On Tuesday 18th May, the students virtually observed court sessions from Leeds Crown Court in the morning and interviewed a Magistrate in the afternoon. This is designed to build on their understanding of criminal law, from previous sessions, of the approach that members of the legal teams take in delivering prosecution and defence cases.

This event is the penultimate session in what has been a 2-year long programme for budding lawyers and barristers.

We plan to re-launch the programme for Year 12 students in September 2021.
