

## Dress Code

	Branding on any items must be discreet	No obstructive pictures/symbols/logos/writing
Bottoms	Smart trousers/ chinos	Hipsters, leather/leather-look/wet look, denim, frayed, clingy, lycra, decorated leggings, jogging bottoms, shorts
	Smart skirt or dress of an appropriate length (mid-thigh)	Bodycon, skorts, leather/leather look/wet look, denim, frayed, clingy, lycra
Tops	Smart shirt with collar/ smart blouse	T shirts, polo shirt, tie-dye, cropped tops, strapless tops, spaghetti strap tops, plunging necklines, see-through or revealing clothing, lumberjack type shirt
Knitwear	Smart jumper or cardigan	Garments in sweatshirt style material, hoodies within school (permissible as an outdoor coat for travel to and from school)
Outerwear	Coat - to be removed once inside classrooms Tailored jacket/blazer	Denim jacket, leather jacket
Footwear	Smart formal shoes, boots or sandals (leather/leather look/suede/suede look)	Trainers/pumps/flip flops/sports style shoes (including Vans, Converse, black trainers), Ugg boot style, no bright coloured footwear
Accessories	Tie Scarf Discreet jewellery (small nose stud allowed)	Nose rings Ear lobe stretchers Stretchers Hats
Hair	Natural hair colours only	No extreme styles or colours
