Counselling Service at School

The counselling service at school offers drop-in sessions to students. These involve an informal discussion with the student about their current concerns and mental well-being and, if appropriate, strategies which can assist them. Drop ins can be accessed either with or without an appointment and usually last for up to 30 minutes. For those students wanting to access more formalised counselling, blocks of up to 6 sessions can be offered. These sessions last up to 50 minutes each. Referrals for blocks of counselling should be discussed with the student's Senior Tutor who will make the referral on their behalf. Sixth Form students can also self-refer by completing the counselling leaflets situated on the counselling room door.

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Street Entertainment Initiative
