I found the virtual work experience at Caxton very insightful and knowledgeable; I also learnt a lot of information about what Hedge funds do and how they operate etc. With the virtual work experience it has helped me decide about (hopefully) working in the financial industry when I am older.

National Grid/Net Zero, Ellie Year 12

It has been amazing, and I've learnt so much! It certainly wasn't what I was expecting. It was a 3-day workshop, focusing on the different stages of the National Grid recruitment process. The skills learnt could be applied to any application for a company. We focused on Personal Profiling, Teambuilding, Assessment Centres and Interviews. We were put into breakout rooms on Teams and had to discuss and negotiate and I volunteered to feedback my group's ideas to the rest of the participants and organisers. For the interview session we learned about the STAR method for answering competency-based questions. Again, we were put into break out rooms and each gave examples for questions surrounding problem solving and teamwork. In the main meeting, I put myself forward to answer the interview style question in full using the method in front of everyone. I would feel so much more confident now in a recruitment processes and I have also gained an increased knowledge of the energy sector and what the National Grid are doing to ensure a net-zero future. I would rate it 10/10

Hart Biologicals, Czarek Year 12

The placement offered a valuable insight into Hart Biologicals and what the company does, as we learned how pipettes might be used in a lab, watched videos about the theory surrounding how a blood clot worked and did a small experiment to simulate what a blood clot might look like in real life. For the Kainos placement it was really helpful and a good insight into the industry and how I would be expected to work in teams and the type of work flow that is used nowadays. We also did some coding games which was a great introduction and we explored how you can hack sites and what the common weaknesses of sites are. There was also an introduction into HTML.

Nuclear Engineering, William Year 12

Firstly, the placement was incredibly well presented using a variety of interactive activities and they gave plenty of Q & A opportunities for the students to ask the presenters about their personal experiences. The experience really opened my eyes to all the different roles involved in nuclear engineering and how they collaborate with other types of engineering e.g. civil and manufacturing engineering. I was surprised at the wide range of paths available for students to take to go from college/ sixth form to working within the Engineering industry, for example one of the presenters chose to do a HND in electrical engineering before being employed. This placement has inspired me to aim for the engineering industry when considering career paths.
