

What is involved?

Weekly 1 hour Zoom call on Wednesdays at 6pm in school term time between April 2022 and Spring 2023. The sessions are in small groups and led by trained, current undergraduate or post-graduate students. Self-study materials are provided for you to work through in between sessions... There is a 3 weekly cycle of activity:

Week 1 – Independent Learning Working on questions and problems, on a specific curriculum theme in your chosen subject.

Week 2 – Online Tutorial

Work with a tutor in a small group to build on the independent learning Week 3 – Mentoring Discuss issues relating to university application in your chosen subject.
