- Third person narrative
- Heterodiegetic narrator
- Homodiegetic narrator
- Omniscient narrator
- Limited narrator
- Unreliable narrator

In your Portfolio, make a section for Imagined Worlds and keep your notes there to use during the start of the course.

Poetic Voices

In readiness for studying poetry during the course, research the poet Seamus Heaney and make notes on his work. As an introduction, read 'Blackberry Picking', 'Strange Fruit', 'Mid-Term Break' and 'Follower' making notes on the themes presented and how these link to your research on the poet himself.

Prepare a presentation on the poet and his work that could be presented to your peers in September. This could be a PowerPoint to present or a series of cue cards to enable you to speak for a few minutes.
