


## **Student Academic Advisors**



Student Academic Advisors are experienced students in Sixth Form working with Year 10 and 11 to support their learning in Maths, English and Sciences GCSE study. It is a strategy which helps students to make the most of their studies.

Being a Student Academic Advisor is a voluntary role within school. The requirements will be to provide support and encouragement to Year 10 and 11 students who are mentored in the ILC. To work alongside the ILC Mentors to enable Year 10/11 students to progress to the best of their ability.

Considerations on becoming a Student Academic Advisor. The sixth form student will need to:

- Meet face-to-face on a biweekly basis on a Thursday lunchtime (TBC) in the ILC with students
- Manage the unpredictable nature of the academic questions with Year10/11 students accessing support on a drop in basis
- Facilitate study discussion and practice
- Encourage good study skills and organisation
- Advise on individual academic queries

For the Year10/11 students the aim is to:

- Encourage independent learning
- Get help with aspects of academic work
- Develop successful study strategies
- Discuss and apply knowledge
- Develop skills such as, confidence, communication.

The sixth form Advisors in turn will be developing and be able to evidence skills such as communication, leadership, and community to be used when applying for university or jobs.
