

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Soft Skills

Blindfold Drawing Challenge

- One member of the team volunteers to be blindfolded
- The rest of the team will be shown an object
- The team must not say the name of the object out loud
- The blindfold member will be asked to draw the object
- Each member of the team takes turns to give the artist only ONE instruction
- For example, if you chose to draw a pair of glasses, the instructions could be:
 - Draw 2 semi circles next to one another
 - Link the circles with a straight line
 - Draw a line upwards from the outside edge of each semi circle
 - Draw a short line down from the end of each line, at a 120 degree angle
