





Waiting for confirmation (from July 5)

If you have submitted an application, and accepted Conditional offers, you will see Waiting for Confirmation, whilst universities and colleges confirm their qualifications and other entry criteria.

If you select **Go to application** the firm and insurance choice will also show a blue **waiting for confirmation** banner.










Find a course in Clearing (from July 5)

If you have no offers and are not waiting for any decisions, or have declined any offers you have received, you will see you have not been placed at firm or insurance choices. From here you can search for courses in Clearing.

You must discuss their choice with the university or college first, and only add a Clearing choice if the university or college has advised them to.






Making an application direct to Clearing

If you have not started an application for 2023 you will be able to start a direct to Clearing application. All sections, including a personal statement and reference, should be completed.

You will need to submit your application without any choices and then add your Clearing choice.

If you started your application and added choices to it before 30 June, these will be removed from the application if it is submitted after 30 June.







During the examination results embargos of

If an application has been submitted, during the results embargo periods, you will be taken to a read-only version of your application.

Just before both results days applications will be unavailable whilst our systems are prepared for them.








SQA results day (8 August)

Just before SQA results day on 8 August (UK time) applications will be unavailable whist UCAS systems are prepared for SQA results day.

On results day you will be able to see your confirmation decisions and access your application.


Please note on 8 August the **2024** application service will be unavailable.

JCQ results day (17 August)



Just before JCQ results day on17 August (UK time) applications will be unavailable whist UCAS systems are prepared for JCQ results day. This will update to reflect the status of the application when the embargo ends


If you want to access your application you may see a timer at busy periods.

Please note on 17 August the **2024** application service will be unavailable.



You've been placed!

If you have been successful with your undergraduate application, you'll see a confirmation banner confirming your place at your firm or insurance choice, UCAS will also email you. You should receive details from the university or college about what to do next.





Unconditional change of course

You may be offered an unconditional place with substantial changes to the original choice. This usually happens if you didn't meet your conditions, but the university or college wants to offer you a different course, start date and/or point of entry.


You should check the details in the application, and must reply to the offer. If you have any questions or concerns about the change, you need to speak to the uni or college to find out why they've made this change.

There may be a reason given to explain why the conditional offer hasn't been confirmed yet.


If you have any concerns you should contact your university or college to discuss.



Eligible for Clearing

If you didn't meet the conditions of the offers at either their firm or insurance choice you will be able to use Clearing to search for another course and view your personalised course matches through Clearing Plus.


You can add a Clearing choice from 10:00 on SQA results day and 13:00 on JCQ results day*.

Clearing Plus



In Clearing Plus the matches you see are unique to you and constantly updated.


If you express an interest in a course (up to 5 at a time), that university or college can contact you.

Remember, courses in Clearing fill up quickly, and you may not be contacted by a university or college you have expressed interest in.

We'd recommend they also look for courses in Clearing using our <u>search tool</u>.

Application status





The status bar at the top of the application shows current status, and eligibility for Clearing.

Latest updates will reflect the latest action.

It will display their Clearing number (six digits) if eligible.

You will also have a ten-digit Personal ID (PID), and may need to quote one or both of these when contacting universities and colleges in Clearing.


Adding a Clearing choice



You can add a Clearing choice from:


- 10:00 on SQA results day*.
- 13:00 on JCQ results day*.

*All timings are UK time





Adding a Clearing choice (Step 1)



To add a Clearing choice you must have permission from the university or college to do so.

Ensure that you have contact the university or college and they have told you to add their courses as a Clearing choice. If you don't do this, your application may be delayed.

Once you've added your Clearing choice, you will not be able to change it until the university or college has made a decision. If you are accepted, you will be firmly committed to that course.



Adding a Clearing choice (Step 2)




You should only add a Clearing choice once you have permission from the university or college.

You need to enter the course details by the date the university/college have given you.





Adding a Clearing choice (Step 3)



Only one Clearing choice can be added at a time.


If the university/college does not accept the Clearing choice (Unsuccessful) or you choose to use 'Decline my place' after Clearing choice has been accepted, then you'll be able to add a new Clearing choice.



University/College Supplied Code


If the university or college has supplied you with a specific course code for a course available in Clearing, you must enter it using this option.

This may be the case for competitive courses where vacancies are rare and usually filled quickly.





University/College Supplied Code






Clearing choice

You don't need to reply to a Clearing offer.

Once the choice has been added, it's up to the university or college to confirm the place.

The confirmation will reflect in your application.

Clearing choice - Unsuccessful, declined and withdrawn




If the university/college does not accept the Clearing choice (Unsuccessful) or the applicant chooses to use 'Decline my place' after Clearing choice has been accepted, then they'll be able to add a new Clearing choice.



Decline my place (Step 1)

From 5 July, if you are holding an unconditional firm place, you can release yourself into Clearing, by using the 'Decline your place' button in the application.

This is available until 6 September 2023.






Decline my place (Step 2)

You should only use this if you no longer wish to take up your place at your confirmed firm choice.

Using it will mean your place will be declined and your contract with the university or college will be cancelled, including any arrangements made for accommodation or scholarships.

You will need to confirm you want to decline your place.






Decline my place (Step 3)

You may find the best option isn't to decline your place; other options are available.

You should never be pressured into making a decision, if you are unsure, give UCAS a call to discuss your options.



Decline my place (Step 3)

If you use 'Decline my place' you will then enter Clearing.

You will be able to apply for another course through Clearing or view your matches in Clearing Plus.
