


# Junior Band take part in Spring Fest


#### Summer Concert

#### **Education Conference**



On Saturday June 10th Year 12 sociology students; Maria, Lauren, Tabitha and Liv (and their teacher Mrs Wraight) attended the inaugural Quaker Education conference at Bootham School in York, entitled "How can Education create a better world". The in-person conference, attended by 150 students with both UK and international delegates, was the culmination of a longer programme in which 8 Sixth Form students had involved themselves in online conferences and submitted a short film on the conference title. The 4 students who attended the conference listened to some excellent speakers which included the mental health campaigner Natasha Devon and Ruth Ibegbuna, Founder and CEO of RECLAIM, The Roots Programme who urged students to reject negative labels. In addition, the students were spurred into action with talks by Sam Freedman, senior fellow of the Institute for Government who talked to students about how to most effectively reach people of power, and Ben Rich, Liberal Democrat policy advisor and current CEO of Radix, a cross party think tank who gave them a masterclass in manifesto writing. Working in teams of 8 the students produced documents which are being brought together as a manifesto for change in educational priorities to be presented at this weekend's 'Big Tent' event at the York Festival of Ideas, where Government Ministers, Shadow Ministers, leading journalists, commentators, local MPs and council leaders will discuss their proposals.

The whole day was inspirational for our Year 12s at a key time when they are considering what they would like to do after Sixth Form.

#### **Athletics News**

Three school teams have qualified for the English Schools' team National Finals in Essex, taking place in July. Year 7/8 Girls, Year 9/10 girls and Year 9/10 Boys all won their regional final early in June to qualify, with the year 7/8 boys' team finishing 3rd. Lots of athletes won their events and this all added up to some great team performances.

Highlights were Ella McIntosh throwing a new school record of 42m in the hammer, Indi Harby, pole vaulting a new school record of 2.20m. Niamh Robinson and Luke Shacklock have set new school 1500m records in the last few weeks representing Yorkshire.

It is no surprise that Luke Shacklock has also been selected for North Yorkshire to run 1500m steeplechase at the English Schools' Championships. This is great reward for Luke who has raced well over 1500m and steeplechase this Summer. Many others also competed for the county at the Northern Counties match earlier this month - Grace Fisher, Alice Fisher, Indi Harby, Ollie Holt, George Wastling, Niamh Robinson, Josh Keay, and Ella McIntosh.

At the Harrogate and Craven district athletics, the school took a big team of athletes to compete, with quite a few Year 7 boys and girls making their first appearances on the track or field. Lots of 1st, 2nd, and 3rd places from athletes in sprints, hurdles, middle distance races, throws and jumps. Head of Biology Dr Bryant commented "It has been a great privilege to manage and coach the athletes this Summer." We are very grateful for time and energy Dr Bryant gives to Athletics at St. Aidan's – thankyou.
