Year 13 Reminder: Application Deadlines

A reminder of the school deadlines and important dates for Post 18 applications are as follows:

These are the deadline dates students need to adhere to, rather than dates published on the UCAS website.

- UCAS Conservatoire Music courses: 19th September
- Oxbridge, Medicine, Dentistry and Veterinary applications: 29th September
- All other UCAS applications: 17th October
- Apprenticeships begin to be advertised: October onwards
- Art & Design Foundation Diploma: 22nd November
- Bulk of Apprenticeships with Autumn start date begin to be advertised: January Onwards
