

Course Outline/Learning Journey: A Level Fine Art Year 12

Rationale-

The Fine Art course starts with a short introductory exploration project, designed to improve skills in a range of material and media areas, through experimental and problem-solving activities. The brief focuses on the design process, exploring ways of recording and developing a theme through a range of visual interpretation. You will be introduced to the design concepts, audience engagement and design for purpose. Each weekly task gives opportunities to recap key skills and processes. Creativity, imagination, enthusiasm and the ability to problem solve are tested early through fast paced teacher led lessons. Initial exploration and research inform ideas, encourage exploration, development, and refinement. These ideas conclude with an outcome or outcomes. Following the 6 week introductory projects you will identify your strengths and develop your own brief for your major coursework project. Fortnightly assessment and planning will guide you forward through the four assessment objectives, with regular feedback that will encourage further investigation and develop a broader context to your initial ideas.

By April, you will have gained knowledge in a range of material techniques and a clear grounding in the design process and will commence your Personal study, a 3000 word essay that explores a key theme, impacting the development of your practical work. Focus is placed on cultural and contextual understanding as well as strong analytical skills. This is presented alongside your coursework and culminates in an outcome or outcomes. This coursework project runs until February in Year 13 and is known as component1.

On 1st February in Year 13, the externally set component2 is released. This runs for 10 weeks and follows a project journey the same as component 1, culminating in an outcome or outcomes produced under timed conditions (15 hours).
