Course Outline: Performing Arts

Year 12

Rationale

Students begin looking at practitioners and understanding their performance conventions and contextual factors from the beginning of year 12. This feeds into both their performance opportunities and then embeds the knowledge for the written exam at the end of Year 12, following which students begin to apply their developed performance skills to a devised performance. In Year 13 students continue to build on their performance knowledge within musical theatre in a showcase style assessed performance, followed by the final externally assessed devised unit – utilising all creative and practical skills developed across the course.
