

<u>Course Outline/Learning Journey:</u> Tutorials (Personal Development)

Year 12

Rationale: The Tutorial programme complements the Core RE programme at St John Fisher and the Living Well programme at St Aidan's to ensure in conjunction with Assemblies at both schools that your personal development is extremely well catered for. The weekly programme throughout Year 12 has modules focusing on study skills, healthy relationships, careers, mental and physical health, British values, society and life skills, exam preparation, university applications and next steps (apprenticeships and jobs). Areas that are taught post-Christmas notably health and British values will be the focus of assemblies early in the first term. While aspects of students spiritual, moral, social and cultural development are addressed these are also part of the Core RE/Living Well and assembly programmes. The Healthy relationships module also addresses RSE while the modules relating to Careers support the ongoing CIEAG across the Associated Sixth Form.
