William Akroyd's Foundation Open Scholarship Essay Competition – Monday, 27 November at 9.15 am in E10 (English classroom on first floor of Bede House at St Aidan's)

The 16 students who completed application forms to enter for the William Akroyd Scholarship should have received an email from Mrs Humphrey confirming the date, time and venue of their test. Please arrive at least 15 mins before the start time of this test to enable the invigilators to read through information prior to your test. A seating list will be displayed on the classroom door on the morning of the test. You will have two hours to complete one essay from a choice of 15 questions.

Year 13 Mock Exams

Seating lists will be displayed for ALL rooms on the noticeboard in the Sixth Form café at St Aidan's and the Collins Entrance at St John Fisher at least a day before each exam and also outside CGH on the morning/afternoon of each exam. Most exams will take place in Constance Green Hall, Hatcher Room (adjacent to CGH) the Bede IT (Study) Room (on first floor in Bede) or the small careers rooms (on first floor in Bede). The only exceptions are:

- Music exam will be in MU3 at St Aidan's
- French exams will be in IT3 in St Aidan's Main School
- Music Technology will be in G16 at <u>St John Fisher</u>
- Art exams in Art rooms of the school you are taught (Art Teachers will confirm beforehand)

Please note:

- Students with exams in CGH should leave their bags and coats in the signposted room on the right in the huts closest to CGH which will be locked during the exams.
- It is ESSENTIAL that students wear their lanyards and bring ALL the equipment they will need for their exams (in particular, calculators and rulers) as we only have limited supplies to loan to students. If you don't come fully prepared, having to hand out spare equipment can delay the start of the exams. Please check with your Subject Teachers as to what equipment you require for your exams.
- Please arrive 15 minutes prior to the start time of your exam. Morning exams begin at 9.00am and afternoon exams at 1.30pm.
- Students are reminded that they are expected to attend all lessons when they are not in exams.

UCAS Applications

We are delighted that so many students met or nearly met the 20 October deadline for submitting UCAS applications to the Sixth Form Office. If yours is still outstanding, please get it to us asap, or if you know you are not applying to university this year, please let us know so we don't chase you. Just to clarify, all applications received by UCAS before their deadline of 31 January 2024 are given equal consideration.

Year 13 online interviews

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Year 13 Projected Grades

These will be issued w/c 20th November. Please see the below regarding EPQ.

EPQ grades

EPQ students were not given UCAS grades and will not receive predicted grades throughout the course. This is in response to advice from the awarding body, AQA, that EPQ grades should not be predicted. The course is completely different to any other subject in that it is a supervised, independent project rather than a taught course and there are no assessments from which to make a prediction. The careers department have verified this advice with a number of universities who have all agreed they are not expecting to see predicted grades for EPQ and have confirmed that students will not be in any way disadvantaged because of this. Students will be given effort grades throughout the course and at the end of April they will receive their mark, although this is subject to moderation.

On Monday 20th November, in RS1 at 12:45pm Mrs Wraight will be running a 'how to tackle a 30 mark essay' revision session as it seems a long time since you did one!! In line with our revision of paper 1, the focus will be on Education Policy. At the session you can expect to learn some top tips for essay structure, plus get a recap of a tricky topic Globalisation and education. All are welcome. Aimed mainly at year 13 but any interested Year 12's can attend too.

On Monday 27th November, in RS1 at 12:45pm Mrs Wraight will be running a 'Sociology in a nutshell: Neo Liberal and Socially Democratic views of education' revision session. In line with our revision of paper 1. An overview of the topic plus past exam questions and a sociologists quick guide. All are welcome.
