Important Notice for Students Exiting St John Fisher

Students should <u>not</u> exit through the main doors at reception or the fire doors. This has previously been made very clear. It is not acceptable that students are continuing to do this and being disrespectful to reception staff in the process. Sixth Formers should remember that they should be setting an example of good behaviour to younger students and act accordingly. We would be grateful to parents/carers to reinforce this with students.

Year 13 Mock Exams

Seating lists will be displayed for ALL rooms on the noticeboard in the Sixth Form café at St Aidan's and the Collins Entrance at St John Fisher at least a day before each exam and also outside CGH on the morning/afternoon of each exam. Most exams will take place in Constance Green Hall, Hatcher Room (adjacent to CGH) the Bede IT (Study) Room (on first floor in Bede) or the small careers rooms (on first floor in Bede). The only exceptions are:

- Music exam will be in MU3 at St Aidan's
- French exams will be in IT3 in St Aidan's Main School
- Music Technology will be in G16 at <u>St John Fisher</u>
- Art exams in Art rooms of the school you are taught (Art Teachers will confirm beforehand)

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Please note:

- Students with exams in CGH should leave their bags and coats in the signposted room on the right in the huts closest to CGH which will be locked during the exams.
- It is ESSENTIAL that students wear their lanyards and bring ALL the equipment they will need for their exams (in particular, calculators and rulers) as we only have limited supplies to loan to students. If you don't come fully prepared, having to hand out spare equipment can delay the start of the exams. Please check with your Subject Teachers as to what equipment you require for your exams.
- Please arrive 15 minutes prior to the start time of your exam. Morning exams begin at 9.00am and afternoon exams at 1.30pm.
- Students are reminded that they are expected to attend all lessons when they are not in exams.

If we do not get these in, we cannot guarantee they will be submitted before the UCAS deadline OR we may not have time to write references for them.
