Senior Maths Challenge Textile work by Year 10



The Senior Maths Challenge was held this term. 101 students from St. Aidan's entered from across Y12 and 13. Of that they achieved an amazing haul of certificates - 41 Bronze, 28 Silver and 6 Gold - 75% achieved certificates which is excellent given that the UKMT award to the top 66% of entries. The 6 students who achieved Gold are Jerram Bishop, Leah Helm, Stan King, Oliver Dilley and Toby Williams from Year 13 and Kathryn Shores from Year 12.

Jerram and Leah both scored 95, making them joint Best in School. All 6 Gold certificate students qualified for the followon round - the Andrew Jobbings Senior Kangaroo. They took part and all 5 obtained a certificate with Jerram Bishop (Year 13) achieving a MERIT which means he was in the top 25% of entries. This round was open only by invitation to those students who excelled in the Senior Maths Challenge, putting all 5 students in the top 11% of students nationally to even qualify for entry. Jerram's result puts him in the top 3%of the country overall. Congratulations everyone!

Post-16 choices

One important aspect of Year 11 is making applications for post-16 choices, whether students are considering moving on to a sixth form, starting a course at college, or beginning their employment journey through an apprenticeship. The careers team have thoroughly enjoyed working with the Year 11 students this half term within assemblies, extended form time presentations and activities, and individual careers appointments. We will continue to support the students as we move through the rest of the academic year, with the aim of supporting them to make an informed decision about which post-16 pathway may suit them best, both in terms of individual learning style and longer-term career aspirations.


A great time was had by all and it's fair to say we raised the old roof of our local theatre when we all joined in with the obligatory "Oh no it isn't's!"
