Anthony Nolan Presentation

To support students in learning about ways that they can be potential lifesavers, a presentation will be delivered by The Hero Project, an education programme run by blood cancer charity Anthony Nolan. This will take place on **Wednesday 28 February** to Year 12 students during Living Well. Any Year 13 student who is free is welcome to attend.

The presentation does not contain any graphic content, but it does touch on subjects which some students may find sensitive. We will advise students at the start of the session that they can leave if they feel uncomfortable at any stage. The presentation will introduce the concept of altruistic donation, highlight why donation matters, what is involved in donating and how people sign up as potential donors. There will also be time for students to ask questions about what they've heard.

School are also holding a donor recruitment event on **Thursday 7 March** from 11-1.30 in the café. At this event Year 12 and Year 13 students can complete both the form and the swab on the day in person.6
