Look for a variety of non-fiction texts that **represent** this place: these could range from visitor guides, product packaging, 'what's on' posters, transcripts of people discussing the place, documentaries and online videos. Present your findings in a collage or Powerpoint presentation. Can you make any observations about the language and images used?
